**Robert MacIntyre (T1/-10)**

- Holds first 36-hole lead/co-lead on the PGA TOUR; previous best 36-hole position: 2<sup>nd</sup> (2024 Myrtle Beach Classic)
- 130 marks his best opening 36-hole score on TOUR (previous: 131/2024 Myrtle Beach Classic, finished T13)
- Making his 45<sup>th</sup> start on the PGA TOUR and first at the RBC Canadian Open; the Scotland native earned his PGA TOUR card via the 2023 DP World Tour Top 10
- Seeks to become the 17<sup>th</sup> player to make the RBC Canadian Open their first PGA TOUR victory and first since 2009 (Nathan Green)
- Best finish on TOUR: 2<sup>nd</sup>/2023 Genesis Scottish Open

**Ryan Fox (T1/-10)**

- Holds his first 36-hole lead/co-lead on the PGA TOUR; previous best 36-hole position: T6 (2024 WM Phoenix Open/T41)
- 130 marks his best opening 36-hole score on TOUR (previous: 134/2024 WM Phoenix Open, finished T41)
- At No. 63 in the Official World Golf Ranking, is the highest-ranked PGA TOUR member that has not played in a Signature Event this season; entered the week No. 8 in the Aon Swing 5 standings and is currently projected to move to No. 1
- Making his first start at the RBC Canadian Open; the New Zealand native earned his PGA TOUR card via the 2023 DP World Tour Top 10; in 14 starts this season, previous best: T4/Myrtle Beach Classic, Zurich Classic of New Orleans
- Seeks to become the 17<sup>th</sup> player to make the RBC Canadian Open their first PGA TOUR victory and first since 2009 (Nathan Green)

**Additional Player Notes**

- Making his fourth start at the RBC Canadian Open and first since 2018, **Joel Dahmen** (3<sup>rd</sup>) records a 5-under 65 during the second round; seeks second PGA TOUR title in his 196<sup>th</sup> start; played 45 events over five seasons on PGA TOUR Canada (2010-2014) and collected two wins in 2014 (The Syncrude Boreal Open Presented by AECOM, PC Financial Open) that finished at the top of the Order of Merit, earning him status on the Korn Ferry Tour
- **Andrew Novak** (T4/-7) seeks his maiden PGA TOUR title in debut appearance at the RBC Canadian Open; owns three top-10 finishes this season (T8/WM Phoenix Open, T8/Mexico Open at Vidanta, T9/Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches)
- The low Canadian on the leaderboard is **Mackenzie Hughes** (T4/-7), who is making his eighth start in the event (best result: T8/2018); Defending champion **Nick Taylor**, who became the first Canadian to win the event since 1954, cards 36-hole 143 to miss the cut; in 14 prior starts this season, has made 11 cuts (best finish: 1<sup>st</sup>/WM Phoenix Open)
- 18-hole leader **David Skinns** follows 8-under 62 with a second-round 1-over 71 and is T4
- Of the 28 Canadians in the field, eight made the cut (Mackenzie Hughes/T4, Corey Connors/T13, Wil Bateman/T13, Taylor Pendrith/T30, Ben Silverman/T42, Myles Creighton/T42, David Hearn/T55, Adam Svensson/T55)
- **Carl Yuan** (injury) and **Doug Ghim** (illness) withdrew before the second round

**Aon Next 10, Aon Swing 5**

- The RBC Canadian Open is the final Full-Field Event before the last two Signature Events of the season (the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, Travelers Championship)
- The Aon Next 10 for the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday is set through the RBC Canadian Open; it is set through the U.S. Open for the Travelers Championship
- FedExCup points earned during the Myrtle Beach Classic, Charles Schwab Challenge and RBC Canadian Open count towards the Aon Swing 5 for the final two Signature Events
- *Note: Not all players who qualify for the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday through the Aon Next 10 or Aon Swing 5 are guaranteed entry to the Travelers Championship*
- Two players are currently projected to move into the Aon Swing 5: **Ryan Fox** (1<sup>st</sup>) and **Joel Dahmen** (3<sup>rd</sup>); Robert MacIntyre is projected to move to No. 10 in the Aon Next 10
