Tom Hoge (T1/-11)

- Fourth career 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR and first since 2022; 0-for-3 to date (T33/2022 PLAYERS Championship, T27/2020 Wyndham Championship, T38/2015 Wyndham Championship)
- Records lowest round of the season with a second-round 64 and sits inside the top-10 after 36 holes for the fourth time this season (T10/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am/finished T6, T6/The Genesis Invitational/finished 8th, T6/THE PLAYERS Championship/finished T54)
- Has one previous top-25 finish (T25/2021) in six prior starts at the RBC Heritage
- Leads the field through two rounds in Strokes Gained: Putting (5.887)
- One career victory on TOUR (2022 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am)

Sepp Straka (T1/-11)

- First career 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR
- Previous best 36-hole position was T2 (two times) at the 2019 Texas Children's Houston Open (finished T4) and 2022 FedEx St. Jude Championship (finished runner-up)
- Leads all players this week with 14 birdies through two rounds (no other player has more than 12)
- Bidding for his second top-10 finish at the RBC Heritage (T3/2022) in his fifth start at the event
- Two-time PGA TOUR winner (2023 John Deere Classic, 2022 Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches)

Collin Morikawa (T1/-11)

- Fifth career 36-hole lead/co-lead in individual stroke-play events on TOUR and first time this season; 1-for-4 to date, with the victory coming at the 2020 Workday Charity Classic (T5/2022 U.S. Open, 2nd/2023 Sentry, T6/2023 TOUR Championship)
- Has recorded one top-25 finish (T7/2021) in four prior starts at the RBC Heritage
- Leads the field through two rounds in Strokes Gained: Around the Green (3.132)
- Entered the week coming off a T3 finish at the Masters Tournament, his third consecutive top-10 finish at the event
- Six-time PGA TOUR winner (2023 ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP, 2021 Open Championship, 2021 WGC-Workday Championship at The Concession, 2020 PGA Championship, 2020 Workday Charity Open, 2019 Barracuda Championship)

J.T. Poston (T1/-11)

- Third career 36-hole lead/co-lead in individual stroke-play events on TOUR; 1-for-2 to date, with the lone victory coming after his most recent 36-hole lead (won the 2022 John Deere Classic wire-to-wire)
- Three top-10s at the RBC Heritage (T6/2019, T8/2020, T3/2022), tied for the most of any player since making his tournament debut in 2019 (Patrick Cantlay, Shane Lowry)
- Two top-10s in the previous four Signature Events this season (T5/The Sentry, T10/The Genesis Invitational)
- Two-time PGA TOUR winner (2022 John Deere Classic, 2019 Wyndham Championship)

Miscellaneous Notes

- In his tournament debut at the RBC Heritage, Ludvig Åberg (T5/-10) looks for his second career victory (won the 2023 RSM Classic) and has finished inside the top 25 in his past seven starts, including two as solo runner-up (AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and last week's Masters Tournament); Åberg leads the field through two rounds in Strokes Gained: Off the Tee (3.085) and Approach the Green (5.136)
- Patrick Cantlay (T8/-9) is making his seventh start at the RBC Heritage and leads all players with five top-10 finishes in the event since making his tournament debut in 2017 (3rd/2023, 2nd/2022, T3/2019, T7/2018, T3/2017); no other player has more than three top-10s over the same span
- Defending champion Matt Fitzpatrick (T18/-6) looks to become the first player since Boo Weekley in 2008 to successfully defend a title at the RBC Heritage
- Coming off his win at last week's Masters Tournament, FedExCup leader and World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler (T10/-8) looks to become the first player since Tiger Woods in 2006 to win a major and win on TOUR the following week (Woods won the PGA Championship and followed it with a win at the WGC-Bridgestone Invitational)
- Fourth event on TOUR this season with at least four players tied for the 36-hole lead (4/Mexico Open at Vidanta, 6/Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, 5/Valspar Championship)
