Scottie Scheffler – history with the 54-hole lead/co-lead

- 12th career 54-hole lead/co-lead in individual stroke-play events on TOUR, the most of any player since he joined the TOUR at the start of the 2019-20 season (second-most: 8, Jon Rahm); 5-for-11 to date converting to victory
- Four 54-hole leads/co-leads in his last five starts (leads the PGA TOUR with four 54-hole leads/co-leads this season)

Scottie Scheffler (1st/-16) – with a victory

- Coming off his win at last week’s Masters Tournament, FedExCup leader and World No. 1 would become the first player since Tiger Woods in 2006 to win a major and win on TOUR the following week (Woods won the PGA Championship and followed it with a win at the WGC-Bridgestone Invitational)
- Would join Bernhard Langer (1985) as the only players to win the Masters Tournament and RBC Heritage in back-to-back weeks (Jack Nicklaus won both events in 1975, but with the Wyndham Championship separating the two)
- Would be his 10th PGA TOUR title in 121 starts and come at the age of 27 years, 10 months
- Would be the first player to win 10 (or more) times on the PGA TOUR in the span of three seasons since Dustin Johnson won 10 titles between 2015-16 and 2017-18
- Would win a career-best four times in a season for the second time (2021-22) and become the first player to win four times in a season since Jon Rahm (4) in 2022-23; would join Phil Mickelson (2), Vijay Singh (3) and Tiger Woods (10) with multiple four-win seasons since the start of the 2000 season
- Would win in his 10th start of the season and second at the RBC Heritage (T11/2023)

- Third-round 63 is his best round since round three of the 2023 Travelers Championship (63) and marks his 38th consecutive par-or-better round to begin the season
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Off the Tee (4.123), Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (9.177), Strokes Gained: Approach the Green (6.278)

Sepp Straka (2nd/-15)

- Ties his best career 54-hole position: 2nd at the 2022 FedEx St. Jude Championship (lost in a playoff) and T2 at the 2022 Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches (won)
- Two-time PGA TOUR winner (2023 John Deere Classic, 2022 Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches)
- Win would come in his 152nd start at the age of 30 years, 11 months, 20 days
- Bidding for his second top-10 finish at the RBC Heritage (T3/2022) in his fifth start at the event
- Leads the field in Driving Accuracy (37 of 42) and Scrambling (12 of 13)

Miscellaneous Notes

- **Collin Morikawa** (3rd/-14) seeks his seventh PGA TOUR title and first since the 2023 ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP; a win on Sunday would come in his 108th start at the age of 27 years, 2 months, 15 days
- RBC ambassador **Sahith Theegala** (T4/-13) is in search of his second PGA TOUR victory (2023 Fortinet Championship) in his 87th start; finished T5 at the 2023 RBC Heritage
- **Patrick Rodgers** (T4/-13) is in search of his first PGA TOUR victory in his 263rd start; is making his 260th start since turning professional in 2014, the most of any player without a win in that span; most recent of four runner-up finishes came at the 2023 Barracuda Championship
- In his tournament debut at the RBC Heritage, **Ludvig Åberg** (T4/-13) looks for his second career victory (won the 2023 RSM Classic) and has finished inside the top 25 in his past seven starts, including two as solo runner-up (AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and last week's Masters Tournament)
- **Patrick Cantlay** (T7/-12) is making his seventh start at the RBC Heritage and leads all players with five top-10 finishes in the event since making his tournament debut in 2017 (3rd/2023, 2nd/2022, T3/2019, T7/2018, T3/2017); no other player has more than three top-10s over the same span
