• 68 professionals at 6-under 138 from a field of 132 professionals

- Lowest 36-hole cut on TOUR since the 2024 CJ CUP Byron Nelson (6-under 136)
- Sets the lowest 36-hole cut in tournament history (previous: 5-under 139/2021, 2023)

Beau Hossler (1st/-15)

- Seeking first PGA TOUR win in 200th start
- Most recent of three runner-up finishes came at the 2023 ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP
- Ties career-best second round score on TOUR: 2020 Shriners Children's Open/2021 Procore Championship/2022 THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson
- 129 marks career-best opening 36-hole score on TOUR (previous: 130/2024 Wyndham Championship/finished T12)
- Holds sixth 36-hole lead/co-lead in an individual stroke-play event (0-for-5 to date); held the second-round lead at the 2023 Zurich Classic of New Orleans (with partner Wyndham Clark)
- Seeks to become the fourth second-round leader/co-leader to convert for the win at the Sanderson Farms
 Championship since the event moved to the Country Club of Jackson in 2014 (Ryan Armour/2017, Cameron
 Champ/2018, Mackenzie Hughes/2022)
- Thirteen players have made the Sanderson Farms Championship their first TOUR win (most recent: Sebastian Munoz/2019)
- Making fourth start at the event (T10/2018, T57/2021, T28/2023)
- In his seventh season on the PGA TOUR after finishing No. 23 in the Korn Ferry Tour Points List in 2017; joined the PGA TOUR as a rookie at the start of the 2017-18 season

Additional Player Notes

- With back-to-back rounds of 65, four-time PGA TOUR winner **Daniel Berger** (2nd/-14) is bogey-free through the opening 36-holes for the first time in his career; records his best opening 36-hole score on TOUR since 2022 (130/Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches/finished 4th)
- **Kevin Streelman** (T41/-7) makes his 300th cut on the PGA TOUR in his 457th start; of the 9,711 players that have made at least one cut on TOUR, only 203 have made 300 or more cuts (2.09% of players)
- Defending champion **Luke List** (T41/-7) trails by eight in bid to become the first player to successfully defended a Sanderson Farms Championship title; two players have won the event twice: Fred Funk (1998, 2004) and Brian Henninger (1994, 1999)

FedExCup Fall Notes

• The 2024 Sanderson Farms Championship is the second event of the FedExCup Fall, a group of eight tournaments played after the TOUR Championship that finalizes eligibility for the 2025 PGA TOUR Season.

- Nos. 1-50 in the FedExCup standings through the TOUR Championship are locked in their positions, while Nos. 51 and beyond carry their FedExCup points into the Fall; Nos. 51-60 through the FedExCup Fall will qualify for two Signature Events in 2025 (AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, The Genesis Invitational)
 - Currently projected to move into Nos. 51-60: Beau Hossler (1st; from No. 87 to No. 56)
 - Currently projected to fall out of Nos. 51-60: Min Woo Lee (not in field; from No. 60 to No. 61)
- The Top 125 will be exempt into all Full-Field events and THE PLAYERS next season and Nos. 126-150 will earn full Korn Ferry Tour status and conditional status on TOUR
 - Currently projected to move into the Top 125: Daniel Berger (2nd; from No. 141 to No. 93), Hayden Springer (T6; from No. 127 to No. 116), Michael Thorbjornsen (T6; from No. 134 to No. 124), Vince Whaley (T22; from No. 126 to No. 125)
 - Currently projected to fall out of the Top 125: Pierceson Coody (MC; from No. 121 to No. 126, Dylan Wu (MC; from No. 122 to No. 127), Matti Schmid (T32; from No. 125 to No. 128), Matt NeSmith (T41; from No. 124 to No. 129)
