# J.T. Poston (Winner/-22)

- Third career PGA TOUR title in his 216<sup>th</sup> start at 31 years, 4 months, 19 days
- PGA TOUR wins (3): 2019 Wyndham Championship, 2022 John Deere Classic, 2024 Shriners Children's Open
- Wins in his first start since the 2024 BMW Championship; finished inside the top 50 in the FedExCup for the third consecutive season (No. 41/2024, No. 39/2023, No. 15/2022)
- Entered the week with four top-10s in 23 starts this season, but none since the RBC Heritage (T5)
- Improves to 2-for-4 when holding the 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (2022 John Deere Classic, 2024 Shriners Children's Open); 27<sup>th</sup> 54-hole leader/co-leader to win on TOUR this season (41 stroke-play events), including six of the last seven (Kevin Yu/2024 Sanderson Farms Championship)
- Projected No. 40 in the Official World Golf Ranking, up from No. 64
- Wins in his ninth appearance at the Shriners Children's Open; entered the week with two top-5 results at TPC Summerlin (T3/2023, T4/2017)

## Doug Ghim (2<sup>nd</sup>/-21)

- Las Vegas resident posts bogey-free 65 including an eagle on the par-5 ninth hole; plays his final 37 holes without a bogey
- Runner-up result marks his best-career finish in his 141<sup>st</sup> start on TOUR (previous: T5/2021 American Express)
- Moved from No. 93 to No. 70 in the FedExCup Fall standings; second top-10 of the season and first since the Mexico Open at Vidanta (T8)

## Additional Player Notes

- Matti Schmid (T3/-19) posts his third-career top-5 finish on TOUR and his second in as many weeks (5<sup>th</sup>/Black Desert Championship)
- PGA TOUR rookie **Rico Hoey** (T3/-19) birdies four of his final six holes for his fourth top-10 finish in his 27<sup>th</sup> start this season
- Michael Kim (T5/-18) posts 62 to tie his career-low round on TOUR (2023 Wyndham Championship/R3) and ties his career-high 10 birdies in a round (2024 American Express/R2); jumps from No. 129 to No. 112 in the FedExCup Fall standings with his second top-10 of the season and first since The American Express (T6)
- University of Florida senior **Ian Gilligan** (T16/-14), the third amateur to make the cut in Shriners Children's Open history (Jack Trent/2019/T29, Patrick Welch/2022/T28), closes with 66-65 on the weekend to improve on his only prior PGA TOUR appearance (T40/2024 Barracuda Championship); plays his final 42 holes without a bogey

## FedExCup Fall Notes

• Nos. 1-50 in the FedExCup standings through the TOUR Championship are locked in their positions, while Nos. 51 and beyond carry their FedExCup points into the Fall; Nos. 51-60 through the FedExCup Fall will qualify for two Signature Events in 2024: AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, The Genesis Invitational; no players moved into Nos. 51-60 this week

- The Top 125 will be exempt into all Full-Field events and THE PLAYERS next season and Nos. 126-150 will earn full Korn Ferry Tour status and conditional status on TOUR next season:
  - Moved into the Top 125: Michael Kim (T5; from No. 129 to No. 112), Joe Highsmith (T16; from No. 133 to No. 125)
  - Fell out of the Top 125: Kevin Tway (DNP; from No. 122 to No. 126), Joel Dahmen (WD; from No. 124 to No. 129)
