Resumption: The first round resumed for 19 players at 7:28 a.m. and concluded at 8:22 a.m. The second round began as scheduled at 7:10 a.m.

Cam Davis (1st/-8)

- Career-low score on the PGA TOUR (62); previous: 63, three times (most recent: R4, 2023 Travelers Championship)
- Ties career-high with nine birdies (fourth instance; first since the second round of the 2023 Rocket Mortgage Classic)
- Holds his third career 18-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (2020 FedEx St. Jude Championship/finished T29, 2022 Charles Schwab Challenge/T7)
- Making sixth consecutive start at the Sony Open in Hawaii; best result: T9/2020
- Finished T52 at The Sentry; 38 of the 59 players that competed at The Sentry are in the field at the Sony Open
- Eligible for all Signature Events in 2024 by finishing in the top 50 in the FedExCup standings in 2022-23

Additional Player Notes

- **Taylor Montgomery** (2nd/-6) opens with a 64 at the Sony Open in Hawaii for the second consecutive year; held a share of the first-round lead in 2023 and went on to finish T12
- **Webb Simpson** (T3/-5) cards a 65 in the first round, his 108th score of 65 or better since he joined the PGA TOUR at the start of the 2009 season (31 more than any other player in that span)
- Chris Kirk (T7/-4), coming off a win at The Sentry last week, has made one bogey in five rounds to start the 2024 season; the last player to win the first two events of a PGA TOUR season was Ernie Els in 2003 (Justin Thomas won The Sentry and the Sony Open during the wraparound 2016-17 season)
- **Gary Woodland**, making his first start on TOUR since the 2023 Wyndham Championship (T27) after undergoing surgery to extract a brain lesion, records a 1-over 71
- Making his first start since the 2022 Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches after undergoing surgeries on his left shoulder and left hip, Tyler McCumber cards an even-par 70

Aon Swing 5

- The Sony Open in Hawaii, the second event of the 2024 PGA TOUR Season and first Full-Field Event, marks the first opportunity for players to earn FedExCup points towards the Aon Swing 5
- The Aon Next 10 and Aon Swing 5 are eligibility pathways for players, not already qualified, to play their way into Signature Events via the FedExCup standings
- The top five players not otherwise exempt who earn the most FedExCup points during the Sony Open in Hawaii, The American Express and Farmers Insurance Open will qualify for the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, while the top five players not otherwise exempt who earn the most FedExCup points during those three events and the WM Phoenix Open, will qualify for The Genesis Invitational
- The Aon Next 10 for the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and The Genesis Invitational was determined through the FedExCup Fall standings

•	The top two players on the leaderboard (Cam Davis, Taylor Montgomery) are qualified for the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Annone of the four players that are T3 are otherwise exempt (Aaron Rai, Austin Eckroat, Stephan Jaeger, Webb Simpson)
