**Weather:** Partly cloudy with brief showers. High of 74. Wind NNW 8-14 mph, with gusts to 22 mph.  
**Cut:** 82 professionals at 2-under 138 from a field of 142 professionals and two amateurs.

**Carl Yuan (T1/-9)**

- Career-low 36-hole score on the PGA TOUR (131); previous: 132/2023 Sanderson Farms Championship (finished T6)
- Second career 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (2023 RBC Canadian Open/finished T18)
- Making second consecutive start at the Sony Open in Hawaii (2023/T21)
- Seeking first career TOUR win in 35<sup>th</sup> start; best result on TOUR to date: 4<sup>th</sup>/2023 Bermuda Championship
- Moved from No. 126 to No. 125 in the FedExCup Fall and Eligibility Points List when Jon Rahm was removed from the list in December, earning full status on TOUR in 2024; without this adjustment, Yuan would not have been eligible for the Sony Open in Hawaii

**Austin Eckroat (T1/-9)**

- Career-low 36-hole score on the PGA TOUR (131); two of his three lowest 36-hole scores on TOUR have come at the Sony Open in Hawaii (131/2024 Sony Open in Hawaii, 132/2023 Sony Open in Hawaii, 132/2023 Travelers Championship)
- First career 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (previous-best 36-hole position: T5/2023 RSM Classic)
- Finished T12 in lone appearance at the Sony Open in Hawaii in 2023
- Seeks first career TOUR victory in 45<sup>th</sup> start; best result on TOUR to date: T2/2023 CJ CUP Byron Nelson

**Byeong Hun An (T1/-9)**

- Fourth career 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (2017 WM Phoenix Open/finished 6<sup>th</sup>; 2019 Wyndham Championship/3<sup>rd</sup>; 2019 Sanderson Farms Championship/3<sup>rd</sup>)
- Following a fourth-place finish at The Sentry last week, posts a bogey-free 64 for his sixth consecutive under-par round to start the 2024 season
- Seeks first career TOUR victory in 182<sup>nd</sup> start; four-time runner-up on TOUR (most recent: T2/Wyndham Championship)

**Additional Notes**

- 18-hole leader **Cam Davis** (T4/-8) stands T4 or better through 36 holes for the fifth time in his 132<sup>nd</sup> career start on TOUR (T1/2020 Sony Open in Hawaii/finished T9, T2/2020 FedEx St. Jude Championship/T29, T2/2022 Travelers Championship/T56, T3/2022 CJ CUP in South Carolina/T13)
- **Chris Kirk** (T4/-8), coming off a win at The Sentry last week, holds two runner-up finishes in 13 prior starts at the Sony Open in Hawaii (2013, 2021); the last player to win the first two events of a PGA TOUR season was Ernie Els in 2003 (Justin Thomas won The Sentry and the Sony Open during the wraparound 2016-17 season)
- **Gary Woodland** (+2) misses the cut in his first start on TOUR since the 2023 Wyndham Championship (T27) after undergoing surgery to extract a brain lesion
- In his first start since the 2022 Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches after undergoing surgeries on his left shoulder and left hip, **Tyler McCumber** (+2) misses the cut
- In his first official start since the 2023 WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play, **Will Zalatoris** misses the cut after scores of 76-69

- Three players tied for the lead is the most through 36 holes on the PGA TOUR since the 2023 PGA Championship (Corey Conners, Viktor Hovland, Scottie Scheffler)
- 82 players made the cut, the most of any 36-hole cut on TOUR since the 2023 Rocket Mortgage Classic (84)

#### **Aon Swing 5**

- The Sony Open in Hawaii, the second event of the 2024 PGA TOUR Season and first Full-Field Event, marks the first opportunity for players to earn FedExCup points towards the Aon Swing 5
- The Aon Next 10 and Aon Swing 5 are eligibility pathways for players, not already qualified, to play their way into Signature Events via the FedExCup standings
- The top five players not otherwise exempt who earn the most FedExCup points during the Sony Open in Hawaii, The American Express and Farmers Insurance Open will qualify for the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, while the top five players not otherwise exempt who earn the most FedExCup points during those three events and the WM Phoenix Open, will qualify for The Genesis Invitational
- The Aon Next 10 for the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and The Genesis Invitational was determined through the FedExCup Fall standings
- Seven of the 13 players at T4 or better on the leaderboard are not otherwise exempt for the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am: **Austin Eckroat (T1), Carl Yuan (T1), Stewart Cink (T4), Keith Mitchell (T4), Stephan Jaeger (T4), Grayson Murray (T4) and Matthieu Pavon (T4)**
