Grayson Murray (T1/-14)

- Defeats Byeong Hun An and Keegan Bradley in a playoff to win the Sony Open in Hawaii, earning his second PGA TOUR title and first since the 2017 Barbasol Championship
- Victory comes 6 years, 5 months, 22 days since the 2017 Barbasol Championship
- Victory comes in his 129th start at the age of 30 years, 3 months, 13 days
- Earns 500 FedExCup points and moves to No. 3 in the FedExCup standings
- Moves to No. 1 in the Aon Swing 5 standings and secures a spot in the seven remaining Signature Events in 2024; other exemptions in 2024 include THE PLAYERS Championship, Masters Tournament, PGA Championship
- Fully exempt on TOUR through the 2026 season (finished No. 7 in the Korn Ferry Tour Points List in 2023 to improve his PGA TOUR status for 2024)
- Improves to 1-for-2 with the 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (T3/2021 Puerto Rico Open, Won/2024 Sony Open in Hawaii)
- Victory comes in his second start at the Sony Open in Hawaii (MC/2021)
- Led the field in Strokes Gained: Off the Tee and SG: Tee to Green

Playoff notes

- Murray makes a 38-foot, 7-inch birdie putt to defeat An and Bradley on the first playoff hole (No. 18)
- Birdie putts missed in the playoff: 17 feet by Bradley; 4 feet, 3 inches by An
- 14th playoff in tournament history and first since 2022 (Hideki Matsuyama def. Russell Henley)
- First playoff of the 2024 season
- Third playoff with three or more participants since the start of the 2022-23 season (5/2023 Sanderson Farms Championship, 3/2023 Rocket Mortgage Classic)

The Sony Open in Hawaii, the second event of the 2024 PGA TOUR Season and first Full-Field Event, was the first
opportunity for players to earn FedExCup points towards the Aon Swing 5

- The Aon Next 10 and Aon Swing 5 are eligibility pathways for players, not already qualified, to play their way into Signature Events via the FedExCup standings
- The top five players not otherwise exempt who earn the most FedExCup points during the Sony Open in Hawaii, The American Express and Farmers Insurance Open will qualify for the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, while the top five players not otherwise exempt who earn the most FedExCup points during those three events and the WM Phoenix Open, will qualify for The Genesis Invitational
- The Aon Next 10 for the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and The Genesis Invitational was determined through the FedExCup Fall standings

Additional Notes

- Byeong Hun An records his fifth career runner-up and third in a playoff (other playoff losses: 2016 Zurich Classic of New Orleans, 2018 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday); An now has four top-five finishes in his last seven starts (T3/2023 Genesis Scottish Open, T2/2023 Wyndham Championship, 4th/2024 Sentry, P2/2024 Sony Open in Hawaii)
- **Keegan Bradley** finishes runner-up for the 10th time in his PGA TOUR career and first since the 2023 Farmers Insurance Open
- **J.T. Poston** (6th/-15) cards a final-round 61, the lowest score of his PGA TOUR career (previous: 62, four times; most recent: R1, 2022 John Deere Classic)
