Scottie Scheffler (Winner/-8) – World No. 1 and FedExCup leader

11th career PGA TOUR title and fifth this season

- 11th PGA TOUR victory in his 124th start at the age of 27 years, 11 months, 19 days
- **PGA TOUR wins (11):** 2022 WM Phoenix Open, 2022 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, 2022 WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play, 2022 Masters Tournament, 2023 WM Phoenix Open, 2023 PLAYERS Championship, 2024 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, 2024 PLAYERS Championship, 2024 Masters Tournament, 2024 RBC Heritage, 2024 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday
- Moves into a tie for 93rd on the all-time PGA TOUR wins list and becomes the 107th player to reach 11 wins on TOUR
- Records career-high with five wins in a season (previous: 4/2021-22)
- Becomes the seventh player (16th instance) with five or more TOUR wins in a season since 1983 and first since Justin Thomas in 2016-17 (5)
- Has won five of his last eight starts on TOUR and finished outside the top 10 once in 13 starts this season (T17/The American Express)
- Becomes the second player since 1950 with five TOUR victories including a major, before the U.S. Open (Arnold Palmer/1960, 1962)
- Becomes the first player with five TOUR victories before the U.S. Open since Tom Watson in 1980 (Watson earned his fifth win in 1980 on May 11)
- Last five instances of a player winning five times in a calendar year on the PGA TOUR before June 10:

Tom Watson, 1980

Johnny Miller, 1974

Arnold Palmer, 1962

Arnold Palmer, 1960

With the win at the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday

- Second player to win the Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, THE PLAYERS Championship, Masters Tournament and the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday in the same year, joining Tiger Woods (2001)
- Only player with multiple wins in Signature Events this season (Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, RBC Heritage, the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday)
- With a final round 2-over 74, records the highest finish by a winner on TOUR since Jon Rahm at the 2020 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday (75/+3)
- Win comes in fourth start at the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday (T22/2020, 3rd/2021, 3rd/2023, Won/2024)

Led by four strokes entering the final round

- Improves to 7-for-13 with the 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR and 4-for-5 converting to victory this season
- Becomes the first player to convert four or more 54-hole leads/co-leads to victory in a single season since Jordan Spieth in 2014-15 (4)

Surpasses 5,000 FedExCup points and \$24 million in Official Money this season

- Holds a lead of 2,172 FedExCup points over No. 2 Xander Schauffele
- Sets the PGA TOUR record for most Official Money in a single season with \$24,024,552
- Third consecutive season setting the record for most Official Money (\$14,046,910 in 2021-22; \$21,014,342 in 2022-23)

Collin Morikawa (2nd/-7)

- Six-time TOUR winner finishes runner-up for the eighth time on TOUR and second at this event (2nd/2021)
- Records his third top-five finish in as many starts (T4/PGA Championship, 4th/Charles Schwab Challenge)
- Was seeking a fourth victory on a Jack Nicklaus-designed venue 2019 Barracuda Championship (Montreux G&CC), 2020 Workday Charity Open (Muirfield Village), 2021 WGC-Workday Championship at The Concession

Adam Hadwin (3rd/-4)

- Finishes solo-third for his best finish since runner-up at the 2023 Shriners Children's Open
- Records his 31st top-10 since the start of the 2017-18 season, the second-most of any player without a win in that span (most: 32/Tommy Fleetwood)
- Was seeking to become the first Canadian to win the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday and the third Canadian to win this season (Nick Taylor/WM Phoenix Open, Taylor Pendrith/THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson)
- Earns an exemption to The 152nd Open Championship at Royal Troon via The Open Qualifying Series as the top player not otherwise exempt
