Scottie Scheffler (1st/-16)

- Holds the 36-hole lead/co-lead for the 10th time on TOUR (2-for-9 to date; 2022 Masters, 2023 WM Phoenix Open)
- Marks 10th consecutive under-par score in as many rounds at The Sentry; is a collective 54-under in those 10 rounds
- Making his first start since winning the Hero World Challenge and first official start on TOUR since the TOUR Championship (T6)
- Earlier this week, named the 2022-23 PGA TOUR Player of the Year, becoming the first back-to-back winner of the Jack Nicklaus Award since Tiger Woods (2005-07)
- Making his third start at The Sentry (T13/2021, T7/2023)

Additional Player Notes

- Brendon Todd (T2/-15) sits 15-under 131 following rounds of 67-64; has 14 consecutive under-par rounds on the PGA TOUR
- Sungjae Im (T2/-15) has 14 consecutive under-par rounds at The Sentry following a second-round 7-under 66; seeking third career TOUR title and first since the 2021 Shriners Children's Open
- Tyrrell Hatton (T2/-15) equals his career-low round on the PGA TOUR with a second-round 62 (previous: R2/2023 Genesis Scottish Open); his 11-under total on Friday marks his lowest score in relation to par on TOUR; one of three players inside the top 10 who are making their debut at The Sentry (Byeong Hun An/T5, Akshay Bhatia/T9)
- Chris Kirk (T5/-14) remains bogey-free through 36 holes following an 8-under 65; round highlighted by five consecutive birdies on Nos. 12-16, equaling his longest birdie streak on TOUR (fourth occasion and first since the first round of the 2018 John Deere Classic); was named the recipient of the PGA TOUR's Courage Award in November
- En route to a bogey-free 64, **An** (T5/-14) played his final four holes in 4-under (B-B-P-E), highlighted by a 6-foot, 3-inch eagle following a 4-iron from 272 yards on the par-5 18th
- Reigning FedExCup champion **Viktor Hovland** (T5/-14) trails by two following a second-round 67 including a 52-foot, 7-inch eagle on the final hole; the last player to win in three consecutive starts on TOUR was Dustin Johnson in 2017 (The Genesis Invitational, WGC-Mexico Championship, WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play)
- Second-round scoring average of 67.475 marks the second lowest field average score to par on the PGA TOUR since 1983 (2003 American Express/R3/-5.72)
