Weather: Partly sunny with thunderstorms in the afternoon. High of 94. Winds S/SE at 5-10 mph. Play was suspended due to dangerous weather at 5:15 p.m. ET and resumed at 6:48 p.m. (suspension of 1 hour, 33 minutes)

Scottie Scheffler (1st/-21)

- Entered the second round holding a seven-shot lead and cards a 5-under 66 to take a four-shot lead at 21-under into the third round
- Previous lowest 36-hole total since the Starting Strokes format started in 2019: 19-under (Scheffler, 2022)
- Previous largest 36-hole lead since the Starting Strokes format started in 2019: 2 (Scheffler, 2022)
- Fifteenth career 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR and first since the 2024 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday (led by 3); 5-for-14 to date with the 36-hole lead/co-lead
- Entered the TOUR Championship at No. 1 in the FedExCup standings for the third consecutive year (T2/2022, T6/2023)
- Fifth consecutive start at the TOUR Championship (5th/2020, T22/2021, T2/2022, T6/2023)
- With a victory, would win the FedExCup for the first time in his career and earn his seventh victory of the season (wins: Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, THE PLAYERS Championship, Masters Tournament, RBC Heritage, the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, Travelers Championship)
- With a win, would become the second player to win THE PLAYERS and the FedExCup in the same season and first since Rory McIlroy in 2019
- Last player to win seven or more times in a single season: Tiger Woods, 2007

3 36-hole leaders/co-leaders to win the TOUR Championship since the Starting Strokes format began in 2019

Additional notes

- Collin Morikawa (2nd) posts the low round of the week with an 8-under 63 to reach 17-under; held a share of the 36-hole lead at the 2023 TOUR Championship after setting the tournament's 36-hole scoring record with rounds of 61-64
- Making his eighth consecutive start at the TOUR Championship, **Xander Schauffele (3rd)** posts a second-round 64 to reach 16-under, marking his 27th of 30 career rounds under par in the event
- Taylor Pendrith (T10) and Ludvig Åberg (T10) lead all first-timers in the field through 36 holes, followed by Matthieu Pavon (T14), Shane Lowry (T14), Aaron Rai (T18), Akshay Bhatia (T21), Byeong Hun An (T25), Robert MacIntyre (T25) and Christiaan Bezuidenhout (28)
