## Scottie Scheffler (1st/-26)

- Entered the third round holding a four-shot lead and cards a 5-under 66 to take a five-shot lead at 26-under into the final round
- Looking to become just the second wire-to-wire champion (no ties) since the Starting Strokes format started in 2019: Patrick Cantlay, 2021
- Entered the final round of the 2022 TOUR Championship with a six-shot lead over Rory McIlroy before finishing T2 after closing with a 73
- Previous lowest 54-hole total since the Starting Strokes format started in 2019: 23-under (Scheffler, 2022)
- Entered the TOUR Championship at No. 1 in the FedExCup standings for the third consecutive year (T2/2022, T6/2023)
- Fifth consecutive start at the TOUR Championship (5<sup>th</sup>/2020, T22/2021, T2/2022, T6/2023)
- With a victory, would win the FedExCup for the first time in his career and earn his seventh victory of the season (wins: Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, THE PLAYERS Championship, Masters Tournament, RBC Heritage, the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, Travelers Championship)
- With a win, would become the second player to win THE PLAYERS and the FedExCup in the same season and first since Rory McIlroy in 2019
- Last player to win seven or more times in a single season: Tiger Woods, 2007

## Additional notes

- Collin Morikawa (2<sup>nd</sup>) records a third-round 67 to remain in solo-second entering the final round; previous best standing entering the final round of the TOUR Championship was T3 (2023); owns six top-five finishes on the PGA TOUR this season and is looking to record his first win since the 2023 ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP
- Making his eighth consecutive start at the TOUR Championship, **Xander Schauffele (4<sup>th</sup>)** posts a third-round 71 to remain at 16-under, marking his 31<sup>st</sup> consecutive par-or-better round at the TOUR Championship
- Shane Lowry (8<sup>th</sup>) and defending FedExCup Champion Viktor Hovland (T13) post the day's low round with 6-under 65s after starting the third round at T13 and T25, respectively
- Lowry (8<sup>th</sup>) leads all first-timers in the field through 54 holes, followed by Ludvig Åberg (T10), Taylor Pendrith (15<sup>th</sup>), Matthieu Pavon (T17), Byeong Hun An (T19), Akshay Bhatia (T22), Aaron Rai (T22), Robert MacIntyre (26<sup>th</sup>) and Christiaan Bezuidenhout (T29)
