Scottie Scheffler (FedExCup Champion/-30)

FedExCup Champion

- Wins the FedExCup for the first time after entering the TOUR Championship at No. 1 in the FedExCup standings for the third consecutive year
- Held the lead in the FedExCup standings for the final 25 weeks of the season (since the completion of the Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard), the longest streak to end the season of any FedExCup Champion since the inception of the FedExCup in 2007 (note: the 2024 season continues through the FedExCup Fall, but the top 50 players are locked into their positions through the TOUR Championship)

Longest streak at No. 1 in the FedExCup to end the season

- 25, Scottie Scheffler (2024)
- 4, Vijay Singh (2008)
- 3, Dustin Johnson (2019-20)

- Fifth player (sixth instance) to enter the TOUR Championship No. 1 in the FedExCup standings and go on to win the FedExCup and first since Patrick Cantlay in 2021
- 50th career week at No. 1 in the FedExCup (second-most all-time)

Most weeks at No. 1 in the FedExCup standings since the inception of the FedExCup in 2007

- Second wire-to-wire champion (no ties) of the TOUR Championship since the Starting Strokes format started in 2019 and first since Patrick Cantlay in 2021

- Tied for 72nd on the all-time PGA TOUR wins list (other active players with 13 wins: Jason Day, Jordan Spieth)

- Second player to win the Masters Tournament and the FedExCup in the same season and first since Jordan Spieth in 2015
- First player to win THE PLAYERS, a major championship and the FedExCup in the same season
- Second player to hold the Olympic gold medal and FedExCup title at the same time and first since Justin Rose (2016 gold medalist, 2018 FedExCup Champion)

World No. 1

- Fourth player (fifth instance) to enter the TOUR Championship at No. 1 in the Official World Golf Ranking and first since Dustin Johnson in 2020
- Current World No. 1 to win the FedExCup**

Additional notes

- **Collin Morikawa** records the low 72-hole score of any player in the field (22-under 262) to finish the season No. 2 in the FedExCup standings, the best result of his career (entered the week No. 7)
- **Russell Henley** cards a 9-under 62 in the final round, the low round of the week
- **Xander Schauffele** (T4) records his sixth consecutive top-five result at the TOUR Championship (only player to finish in the top five in all six editions of the TOUR Championship since the inception of Starting Strokes in 2019)
