Pre-Tournament Notes - 2024 Travelers Championship

TOUR season notes

- With his win at the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, **Scottie Scheffler** captured his 11th PGA TOUR title and fifth of the season, becoming the first player to win five times in a season on TOUR before the U.S. Open since Tom Watson in 1980. Scheffler is also the seventh player since 1983 (16th instance) to win five or more times in a single season on TOUR and first since Justin Thomas in 2016-17 (5)
- 2024 PGA Championship winner Xander Schauffele is coming off a T7 finish at the U.S. Open, one of only two players (Bryson DeChambeau) to have finished in the top-10 in each of this year's three major championships (8th/Masters Tournament)
- With 5,068 FedExCup points, Scottie Scheffler has a 1,951-point lead over Xander Schauffele in the FedExCup standings
- All Signature Event winners this season, except for Rory McIlroy who withdrew on Monday afternoon, are in the field: Chris Kirk (The Sentry), Wyndham Clark (AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am), Hideki Matsuyama (The Genesis Invitational), Scottie Scheffler (Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, RBC Heritage, the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday); McIlroy won the Wells Fargo Championship

Travelers Championship notes

The field includes:

- 29 of the top 30 in the FedExCup standings
- Seven of the top eight in the Official World Golf Ranking
- Six FedExCup Champions
- o Four past winners of the Travelers Championship
- o 16 major championship winners
- o 59 PGA TOUR winners
- The Travelers Championship is the last of eight Signature Events during the 2024 PGA TOUR Season; contested the week after the U.S. Open, 64 of the 71 players in this week's field competed at Pinehurst No. 2
- Course enhancements at TPC River Highlands include the following: fairway widths reduced on Nos. 1, 6, 12, and 13; primary rough added to the downhill slope on No. 12; mounding in the right rough drive zone on No. 6, the right side of No. 9 green and the left side of No. 13; green surfaces reduced on Nos. 9 and 11; teeing ground enlarged and moved to the right on No. 9
- Keegan Bradley holds or shares the 36- (125), 54- (189) and 72-hole (257) tournament scoring records following his 2023 Travelers Championship victory; since his win, Bradley has posted two runner-up results, losing to Grayson Murray in a three-way playoff (Byeong Hun An) at the 2024 Sony Open in Hawaii and tying with Scottie Scheffler five strokes back of winner Davis Riley at the 2024 Charles Schwab Challenge; following his victory, Bradley advanced to the TOUR Championship at the end of the season; the only player to win the Travelers Championship and the FedExCup in the same season is Dustin Johnson (2020)
- Two-time major champion **Collin Morikawa** made his third PGA TOUR start as a professional at the 2019 Travelers Championship as a sponsor exemption and finished T36, the only time he has made the cut at this event (three appearances); the following month he claimed his first of six TOUR titles at the 2019 Barracuda Championship; comes in to this week off three top-five results in his last four starts (T4/PGA Championship, 4th/Charles Schwab Challenge, 2nd/the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, T14/U.S. Open)
- As a Signature Event, the tournament grants four sponsor exemptions to PGA TOUR members:
 - **Billy Horschel** (2014 FedExCup Champion; best Travelers Championship finish/T24/2012)
 - Adam Scott (2013 Masters Tournament; best Travelers Championship finish/T13/2021)
 - Webb Simpson (2012 U.S. Open; best Travelers Championship finish/T5/2013)
 - Michael Thorbjornsen (2024 PGA TOUR University No. 1; best Travelers Championship finish/4th/2022)

Former Stanford University standout Michael Thorbjornsen is now a PGA TOUR member after finishing No. 1 in PGA TOUR University, the second player in history to earn membership via this route (Ludvig Åberg); has played eight PGA TOUR events as an amateur, including the 2022 Travelers Championship where he finished fourth; makes his professional debut this week; PGA TOUR debut was 2019 U.S. Open where he finished 79th; most recent TOUR start was 2023 John Deere Classic (T17)

Top player notes

- World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler is the only player with multiple wins in Signature Events this season (Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, RBC Heritage, the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday); won five of his last nine starts on TOUR and finished outside the top 10 twice in 14 starts this season (T17/The American Express, T41/U.S. Open); Scheffler (5) and Rory McIlroy (2) are the only multiple winners on TOUR this season
- 2022 Travelers Championship winner and Olympic gold medalist in 2020, **Xander Schauffele** makes his sixth appearance at TPC River Highlands where he has three scores of 63 in 18 rounds; won his first major championship at the 2024 PGA Championship; enters this week on a TOUR-leading streak of 49 consecutive made cuts, with Scheffler second on the list with 39
- Corey Conners and Mark Hubbard have both made 17 cuts in 17 starts this season; Conners has made one cut in three appearances at the Travelers Championship (T9/2023) while Hubbard has missed one cut in six appearances at TPC River Highlands (MC/2023); Hubbard seeks his first TOUR victory (last player to make the Travelers Championship his first TOUR title: Ken Duke/2013); Hubbard is one of 12 players in the field this week yet to win on TOUR

Aon Next 10 and Aon Swing 5

Aon Next 10: The top 10 players in the FedExCup standings (not otherwise exempt) through U.S. Open, all in the field Ludvig Åberg earned a sponsor exemption to compete at the 2023 Travelers Championship and finished T24; last week, Åberg held the 36-hole lead at the U.S. Open before finishing T12

Matthieu Pavon earned his first career top-10 finish in a major at the U.S. Open (5th) where he played in the final pairing on Sunday, moving him up to a career-high No. 20 in the Official World Golf Ranking and up to No. 11 in the FedExCup standings

Aon Swing 5: The top FedExCup points earners (not otherwise exempt) from the Myrtle Beach Classic, Charles Schwab Challenge and RBC Canadian Open: Robert MacIntyre, Davis Riley, Ben Griffin, Chris Gotterup, Victor Perez

RBC Canadian Open champion **Robert MacIntyre** will make his Signature Event debut after electing not to compete at the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday
