Weather: Partly cloudy with scattered afternoon thunderstorms. High of 91. Wind S 10-12 mph. Play was suspended at 4:11 p.m. due to lightning in the area and resumed at 7:25 p.m. – a delay of 3 hours, 14 minutes. Preferred lies were in effect for the second round.

Tom Kim (1st/-13)

- On his 22nd birthday, posts his career low 36-hole score on the PGA TOUR (127) and holds his second 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR; 1-for-1 to date converting to victory (2022 Wyndham Championship)
- Seeks fourth PGA TOUR win in his 63rd start (2022 Wyndham Championship, 2022 Shriners Children’s Open, 2023 Shriners Children’s Open); owns two Asian Tour wins (2019 Panasonic Open India, 2022 Singapore International)
- Finished T38 in 2023 in his one prior appearance at the Travelers Championship
- Best result this season is T4 at the RBC Canadian Open
- With a win, would become the first player from South Korea to win the Travelers Championship; six international players from five different countries have claimed this title

Additional Player Notes

- World No. 1 and FedExCup leader **Scottie Scheffler** (T2/-11) pulls within two of the lead following a 6-under 64; has improved in each of his four prior starts at the Travelers Championship (MC/2020; T47/2021; T13/2022; T4/2023); in search of his sixth win of the season and fourth in a Signature Event (Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, RBC Heritage, the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday)
- **Collin Morikawa** (T2/-11) cards 36-hole total of 129, which is second only to the 125 he posted at the 2023 TOUR Championship and went on to finish T6 (FedExCup Starting Strokes); making fourth appearance at this event (T36/2019; MC/2020; MC/2023)
- In his tournament debut, **Akshay Bhatia** (T2/-11) posts career-best 36-hole score on the PGA TOUR (129; previously: 131 2023 Butterfield Bermuda Championship/T20); two lefthanders have won this event in the last 25 years: Phil Mickelson (2001, 2002), Bubba Watson (2010, 2015, 2018)
- With a top-10 finish this week, 2022 Travelers Championship winner **Xander Schauffele** (5th/-10) would post five consecutive top-10 finishes in individual stroke play events for the first time in his career
- Playing in the same pairing, **Shane Lowry** (T6/-9) and **Justin Thomas** (T6/-9) card bogey-free 62 and 63, respectively
 - Lowry equals his career low-round (twice previously: 2024 PGA Championship/R3, 2021 FedEx St. Jude Championship/R3)
- Scotland’s **Robert MacIntyre** (T9/-8) shoots 8-under 62, his career-low 18-hole score on TOUR; marks his first start in a Signature Event since his win at the 2024 RBC Canadian Open
- Defending champion **Keegan Bradley** (T24/-4) attempts to become the first player since Phil Mickelson (2001-2002) to win consecutive Travelers Championship titles
- In his first professional start after becoming a TOUR member as the PGA TOUR University No. 1, **Michael Thorbjornsen** sits T24 at 4-under
