**Third-Round Notes – Saturday, June 22, 2024**

**Weather:** Partly cloudy with afternoon thunderstorms. High of 89. Wind S 8-13 mph. Play was suspended due to a dangerous weather situation at 3:30 p.m. and resumed at 6:19 p.m. (delay of 2 hours, 49 minutes). The third round, which featured preferred lies, concluded at 8:33 p.m.

**Round 4 update:** The final round will feature threesomes off one tee from 6:50 - 11:15 a.m. with an anticipated 4 p.m. finish. Broadcast times: Golf Channel (12 – 2 p.m. ET), CBS/Paramount+/CBSSports.com (2 – 6 p.m. with a live window of 2 – 4 p.m.)

**Tom Kim (1<sup>st</sup>/-18) – with a win**

- A victory on Sunday would be his fourth in 63 PGA TOUR starts and come at the age of 22 years, 2 days
- With a win, would become the fifth youngest four-time winner in PGA TOUR history:

- PGA TOUR wins (3): 2022 Wyndham Championship, 2022 Shriners Children’s Open, 2023 Shriners Children’s Open
- Would become the third wire-to-wire winner in tournament history (Gene Littler/1959, Tim Norris/1982)
- Would become the first wire-to-wire winner (no ties) on TOUR since Lee Hodges at the 2023 3M Open
- Would win after posting his career-best 36-hole (127) and 54-hole score (192)
- Would improve to 3-for-3 converting the 54-hole lead/co-lead to victory (2022, 2023 Shriners Children’s Open)
- Would improve to 2-for-2 converting the 36-hole lead/co-lead to victory (2022 Wyndham Championship)
- Would win in his second appearance at the Travelers Championship (T38/2023)
- Would pick up his second top-10 finish in 19 starts this season (RBC Canadian Open/T4)
- Would become the first player from South Korea to win the Travelers Championship
- Would become the seventh international player from six different countries to win the event; first since Russell Knox (Scotland) in 2016

**Cameron Young (T10/-13)**

- 12<sup>th</sup> different player (13 times) to shoot a sub-60 round on the PGA TOUR (Jim Furyk has a 58 and 59)
- Last player to shoot 59 or better was Scottie Scheffler at TPC Boston in 2020 (59/R2)
- Falls one shy of the PGA TOUR and TPC River Highlands record set by Furyk in 2016 (58/R4)
- TPC River Highlands (Furyk, Cameron Young) and The Old White TPC (Stuart Appleby, Kevin Chappell) are the only courses to give up multiple sub-60 scores

- Round includes two eagles on par-4s: No. 3 (142 yards/PW), No. 15 (4' 2" putt)
- Hit the fewest number of fairways (6) in a sub-60 round on the PGA TOUR
- Opens round with a career-best nine-hole score of 7-under 28, one shy of the Travelers Championship record; Jim Furyk opened the final round in 2016 with an 8-under 27
- Previous low round on TOUR: 62 (2022 Genesis Invitational/R2)
- A first-round 2-over 72 this week marked his 10<sup>th</sup> straight par-or-worse round on TOUR (9 above par, 1 par); 66-59 since

#### Additional Player Notes

- World No. 1 and FedExCup leader **Scottie Scheffler** (T2/-17) trails by one after rounds of 65-64-64; closes third round with four straight birdies; has improved in each of his four prior starts at the Travelers Championship (MC/2020; T47/2021; T13/2022; T4/2023); in search of his sixth win of the season and fourth in a Signature Event (Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, RBC Heritage, the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday)

- With a win, 2024 Valero Texas Open champion **Akshay Bhatia** (T2/-17) would become the third multiple winner of the season (Scheffler/5, Rory McIlroy/2); two lefthanders have won this event in the last 25 years: Phil Mickelson (2001, 2002), Bubba Watson (2010, 2015, 2018)
- With a top-10 finish this week, 2022 Travelers Championship winner **Xander Schauffele** (T4/-16) would post five consecutive top-10 finishes in individual stroke play events for the first time in his career; would become the eighth multiple winner of the event (first since Bubba Watson in 2018); PGA Championship winner would join Scottie Scheffler (5) and Rory McIlroy (2) as multiple winners this season
- **Sungjae Im** (T4/-16) is making his 73<sup>rd</sup> PGA TOUR start since his last win at the 2021 Shriners Children's Open
