## World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler defeats Tom Kim to win the 2024 Travelers Championship

- Marks the 25<sup>th</sup> playoff in Travelers Championship history and first since Harris English defeated Kramer Hickok on the eighth extra hole in 2021
- Sixth playoff of the season and first since Rory McIlroy/Shane Lowry defeated Chad Ramey/Martin Trainer on the first playoff hole at the Zurich Classic of New Orleans
- Playoff records: Scheffler (2-1), Kim (0-1)

# Scottie Scheffler (Winner/-22)

### 12th career PGA TOUR title and sixth this season

- 12<sup>th</sup> PGA TOUR victory in his 126<sup>th</sup> start at the age of 28 years, 2 days
- PGA TOUR wins (12): 2022 WM Phoenix Open, 2022 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, 2022 WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play, 2022 Masters Tournament, 2023 WM Phoenix Open, 2023 PLAYERS Championship, 2024 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, 2024 PLAYERS Championship, 2024 Masters Tournament, 2024 RBC Heritage, 2024 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, 2024 Travelers Championship
- Moves into a tie for 84<sup>th</sup> on the all-time PGA TOUR wins list and becomes the 93<sup>rd</sup> player to reach 12 wins on TOUR
- Becomes the fourth player (ninth instance) with six or more TOUR wins in a season since 1983 and first since Tiger Woods in 2009; is the first to record six wins before July since Arnold Palmer in 1962
- Has won six of his last 10 starts on TOUR and finished outside the top 10 twice in 15 starts this season (T17/The American Express, T41/U.S. Open)

#### With the win at the Travelers Championship

- First player to win the Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, THE PLAYERS Championship, Masters Tournament, the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday and the Travelers Championship in the same year
- Only player with multiple wins in Signature Events this season (Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, RBC Heritage, the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, Travelers Championship)
- Improved in each of his five starts at the Travelers Championship (MC/2020, T47/2021, T13/2022, T4/2023, 1st/2024)
- 258 marks his lowest 72-hole score on TOUR (previous: 261/2023 Travelers Championship); one shy of tournament record set by Keegan Bradley in 2023 (257)

### Surpasses \$27 million in Official Money this season

- Holds a lead of 2,511 FedExCup points over No. 2 Xander Schauffele
- Extends his PGA TOUR record for most Official Money in a single season with \$27,696,858
- Third consecutive season setting the record for most Official Money (\$14,046,910 in 2021-22; \$21,014,342 in 2022-23)

## Tom Kim (P2/-22)

• Three-time TOUR winner picks up his second runner-up finish on TOUR (2023 Open Championship)

- Gene Littler (1959) and Tim Norris (1982) remain only wire-to-wire winners of the Travelers Championship; Lee Hodges is the last wire-to-wire winner on TOUR 2023 3M Open
- Falls to 2-for-3 in converting the 54-hole lead/co-lead to victory (2022 Shriners Children's Open/won, 2023 Shriners Children's Open/won, 2024 Travelers Championship/P2)
- Made his second appearance at the Travelers Championship (T38/2023, 2<sup>nd</sup>/2024)
- Week includes career-best 36-hole (127), 54-hole (192) and 72-hole score (258)

#### **Additional Player Notes**

- **Tom Hoge** (T3) equals his career-low round on the PGA TOUR with an 8-under 62 (fourth time; most recent at the 2023 PLAYERS Championship/R3); first top-10 finish in 10 starts at the Travelers Championship (previous-best: T35/2017)
- Making his 73<sup>rd</sup> start since his last win at the 2021 Shriners Children's Open, **Sungjae Im** finishes T3 in bid to become the first player from South Korea to win the Travelers Championship; has four top-10 finishes in his last six TOUR starts
- Patrick Cantlay (T5) earns his seventh-consecutive top-15 finish at the Travelers Championship
- Tony Finau (T5) picks up his third straight top-10 finish on TOUR: T8/the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, T3/U.S. Open, T5/Travelers Championship; it is his first top-10 in nine starts at the Travelers Championship
- **Justin Thomas** (T5) posts his second-consecutive top-10 finish at the Travelers Championship (T9/2023) and third overall (T3/2016)
- 2024 Valero Texas Open champion **Akshay Bhatia** (T5/-18) was attempting to become the third multiple winner of the season (Scheffler/5, Rory McIlroy/2); two lefthanders have won this event in the last 25 years: Phil Mickelson (2001, 2002), Bubba Watson (2010, 2015, 2018)
- One day after becoming the 12<sup>th</sup> different player (13 times) to shoot a sub-60 round on TOUR, Cameron Young finishes
  T9 following a final-round 66
- Defending champion **Keegan Bradley** finishes T39 in bid to become the first player since Phil Mickelson (2001-2002) to win consecutive Travelers Championship titles
- Tom Hoge (No. 18) and Christiaan Bezuidenhout (No. 20) earn exemptions into the 2024 Open Championship by finishing inside the top 20 of the PGA TOUR FedExCup points standings through the completion of the 2024 Travelers Championship
