### Bryson DeChambeau (1<sup>st</sup>/-7) – with a victory

- Would earn his second major championship title (2020 U.S. Open) in his 31<sup>st</sup> start in a major
- Would become the 23<sup>rd</sup> multiple winner of the U.S. Open and first since Brooks Koepka in 2018
- Would win in first attempt with the 54-hole lead in a major championship (previous best position: 2<sup>nd</sup>/2020 U.S. Open/won)
- Would record the 56<sup>th</sup> victory by a 54-hole leader/co-leader in U.S. Open history (most recent: Wyndham Clark/2023)

# Matthieu Pavon (T2/-4) – with a victory

- Would become the second Frenchman to win a major championship (Arnaud Massy, 1907 Open Championship)
- 2024 Farmers Insurance Open champion would join Scottie Scheffler (5) and Rory McIlroy (2) as multiple winners on the PGA TOUR this season

# Rory McIlroy (T2/-4) - with a victory

- 2011 U.S. Open champion would pick up his 27<sup>th</sup> PGA TOUR title in his 252<sup>nd</sup> start and move to solo 22<sup>nd</sup> place on the TOUR's all-time wins list
- Would become the 21<sup>st</sup> player with five or more major championship victories
- Would win in his 37<sup>th</sup> major championship start since the last of his four major wins (2014 PGA Championship)
- Would become the 23<sup>rd</sup> multiple winner of the U.S. Open and first since Brooks Koepka in 2018
- Would pick up his third win this season (Zurich Classic of New Orleans/with Shane Lowry, Wells Fargo Championship), marking the fifth time with three or more wins in a TOUR season
- Would record the first win by a first-round leader/co-leader at the U.S. Open since Martin Kaymer at Pinehurst in 2014

# Patrick Cantlay (T2/-4) – with a victory

- Would earn his ninth PGA TOUR win in his 176<sup>th</sup> start and first since the 2022 BMW Championship
- Would pick up his first major championship win in his 30<sup>th</sup> major start (best finish: T3/2019 PGA Championship)
- Would win in his ninth U.S. Open appearance (best finish: T14/2022, 2023)
- Would earn the first win by a first-round leader/co-leader at the U.S. Open since Martin Kaymer at Pinehurst in 2014

### **Additional Player Notes**

- In bid to become the first player to win in his U.S. Open debut since Francis Ouimet (1913), second-round leader Ludvig Åberg (T5/-2) records a 3-over 73 to fall five strokes behind DeChambeau
- With a 74 to close last week at Muirfield Village Golf Club and rounds of 71-74-71 this week, World No. 1 and FedExCup leader **Scottie Scheffler** (T42/+6) has four straight over-par rounds for the first time in 120 professional starts on TOUR

# **Miscellaneous Notes**

- The eventual U.S. Open champion has been within four of the lead heading into the final round in the last 25 U.S. Opens
- The largest come-from-behind victory in the final round of the U.S. Open is seven strokes (Arnold Palmer/1960)
