TOP STORYLINES

30 players in the field are qualified for next week's Masters Tournament, up from 11 in 2023. The only way for any of the 126 players in the field (80.8%) that are not currently eligible is with a win at the Valero Texas Open.

The Valero Texas Open is the final tournament that counts toward the Aon Swing 5 for the RBC Heritage, and players 2-5 in the standings as well as all players not otherwise exempt within 60 points of No. 5 are in the field. The winner (Brice Garnett) and runner-up (**Erik Barnes**) from the Puerto Rico Open remain 1-2 in the Aon Swing 5 standings entering the final week of the qualifying period. Barnes, who is competing on a Major Medical Extension this season after missing 10 months of competition following the 2023 Valspar Championship, finished T17 at last week's Texas Children's Houston Open and is making his tournament debut at the Valero Texas Open (Garnett is not in the field).

Billy Horschel enters the week No. 5 in the Aon Swing 5 standings and has not competed in a Signature Event this season. Horschel has three top-five finishes in nine career starts at the Valero Texas Open: T3/2013, 3rd/2015, T4/2016.

Ryan Moore, currently No. 8 in the Aon Swing 5 standings, has three top-10s in seven prior starts at the Valero Texas Open, highlighted by a solo-third in 2019.

Rory McIlroy is the highest-ranked player in the field at No. 2 in the Official World Golf Ranking and will be making his sixth start of the season. McIlroy's streak of five starts to start the season without a top-10 is his longest such streak since 2010, his first season as a member, when he won the Wells Fargo Championship in his sixth start, earning his first career PGA TOUR title. McIlroy is making his third start at the Valero Texas Open, highlighted by a runner-up in 2013, and is competing on TOUR the week before the Masters Tournament for the sixth time in his career.

2016 Valero Texas Open winner and four-time PGA TOUR winner **Charley Hoffman** is making his 500th career start on the PGA TOUR. This is the third consecutive year that a player has made their 500th career start on TOUR at the Valero Texas Open, with Hoffman joining Matt Kuchar (T2/2022) and Lucas Glover (45th/2023). Hoffman is the second player to reach the milestone this season along with Ryan Palmer, who made his 500th career start at the Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches. 2008 and 2009 Valero Texas Open winner Zach Johnson is making his 497th start this week and will make his 498th start at next week's Masters Tournament. Hoffman has earned \$4,649,822 in Official Money at the Valero Texas Open, the most of any player in tournament history (second: \$3,181,260/Corey Conners).

ADDITIONAL STORYLINES

Hoffman is making his 18th start at the Valero Texas Open and has seven top-10s at the event, the most of any tournament in his career.

Corey Conners earned his second Valero Texas Open title in 2023 (first: 2019), becoming the first player to earn his first two wins at the same event since K.H. Lee won the 2022 CJ CUP Byron Nelson. Due to COVID-19, the Valero Texas Open was not held in 2020 and Conners finished T14 as the defending champion in 2021. With a win, Conners would become the first player since World War II to earn his first three wins at the same event. Conners has made 15 consecutive cuts, tied for the fifth-longest active streak on TOUR, and is coming off a T13 at THE PLAYERS Championship.

Hideki Matsuyama made his tournament debut at the 2021 Valero Texas Open (T30) a week before winning his first major championship title at the 2021 Masters Tournament. Matsuyama, who will make his fourth start at the event (WD/2022, T15/2023), enters the week No. 3 in the FedExCup standings, the highest position of any player in the field. He has one win (The Genesis Invitational) and one additional top-10 in eight starts this season.

104 players in the 156 player field competed at last week's Texas Children's Houston Open, including five that finished in the top 10: **Alejandro Tosti** (T2), **Max Greyserman** (T7), **Billy Horschel** (T7), **Aaron Rai** (T7) and **David Skinns** (T7).
