Today – Humidity has returned to the Hill Country with widespread low clouds in place this morning. Additionally, areas of drizzle or a few light rain showers will be possible through 3pm. Breaks in the cloud cover likely occur by the late afternoon with temperatures reaching the lower 80s. Southerly winds will remain brisk, but not as strong as yesterday. Peak gusts of 22-26 mph are expected between 10am-2pm. Forecast rainfall: Less than 0.02". **Sunrise: 7:16am / Sunset: 7:55pm**

Extended forecast – A weak front will move through San Antonio late tonight. Some light shower activity could accompany the front, otherwise northerly winds behind the front will usher in a much drier airmass. This should lead to decreased cloud cover during the day Sunday with temperatures reaching the lower 80s. Northerly winds could gust 15-20 mph during the morning but likely diminish and turn southeasterly during the afternoon. Humidity will abruptly return Sunday night into Monday with extensive cloud cover and even a threat for showers/T-storms returning to the area. Viewing the solar eclipse will likely be difficult around the San Antonio area.
