## **TOP STORYLINES**

The Valspar Championship is the 13th event of the 2024 PGA TOUR Season. The field includes 16 of the top 50 players in the Official World Golf Ranking, led by No. 5 **Xander Schauffele** and No. 8 **Brian Harman**, who finished runner-up at last week's PLAYERS Championship. Schauffele is making his second career start at the event, finishing T12 in his tournament debut in 2022, while Harman is making his 10th start (best result: T5/2022).

2023 champion **Taylor Moore** is defending a title on the PGA TOUR for the first time. After winning the Valspar Championship, Moore went on to advance to the TOUR Championship for the first time in his career (T29). Now in his third season on the PGA TOUR, Moore has made all seven cuts in 2024 with his best result coming at The Sentry (T25). The Valspar Championship is the only event that has had multiple successful title defenses since the start of the 2018-19 season, with each of the last two players earning their first Valspar Championship title going on to win the following year. Scottie Scheffler successfully defended his title at last week's PLAYERS Championship; the last time there were successful title defenses on the PGA TOUR schedule was in 2007 when there were three straight.

2021 and 2022 Valspar Championship winner **Sam Burns** is making his sixth consecutive start at the event and is coming off a T6 in 2023. Burns leads all players with three top-10s at the event since making his tournament debut in 2018 and holds the lowest scoring average (68.85) in tournament history among players with a minimum of 10 rounds. Burns has four top-10s this season, tied with Sahith Theegala for the third-most on TOUR, and enters the week No. 18 in the FedExCup standings. His top-10s came in four consecutive starts: T6/The American Express, 10th/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, T3/WM Phoenix Open, T10/The Genesis Invitational.

In addition to Puerto Rico Open winner **Brice Garnett**, who earned a tournament winner's exemption through the 2026 season, four players played their way in to the Valspar Championship by virtue of their top-10 finish: **Erik Barnes** (2nd), **Hayden Springer** (T3), **Austin Cook** (T6), **Evan Harmeling** (T10). Playing on a Korn Ferry Tour Medical Extension, Barnes was defeated by Garnett on the fourth playoff hole for his best career finish on TOUR in 22 starts. Harmeling made his TOUR debut in Puerto Rico as an Open Qualifier.

PGA TOUR rookie **Jimmy Stanger**, a native of Tampa, Florida, is competing in the Valspar Championship for the third time and first as a PGA TOUR member. Stanger made his first career TOUR start at the 2017 Valspar Championship as a sponsor exemption (MC) and played the event again in 2018 (MC). Stanger enters the week following his first top-10 on TOUR at the Puerto Rico Open (T3) and a T35 in his PLAYERS Championship debut, the best finish by a 2024 rookie.

The next Signature Event on the schedule is the RBC Heritage. The cutoff for the Aon Next 10 is through the Masters Tournament while the events for the Aon Swing 5 are the Puerto Rico Open, Valspar Championship, Texas Children's Houston Open and Valero Texas Open.
