TOP STORYLINES

The field: The only tournament that was a Designated event in 2023 that is not a Signature Event in 2024, the WM Phoenix Open features a field made up of the PGA TOUR's top performers, with 34 of the top 50 from the 2022-23 FedExCup standings in the field. Five of the top 10 players in the Official World Golf Ranking are in the field, led by World No. 1 and two-time defending WM Phoenix Open champion Scottie Scheffler and Wyndham Clark, who moved to No. 6 following his win at last week's AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am.

Three-peat opportunity: With a win at the WM Phoenix Open, World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler would become the first player to win the same PGA TOUR event three years in a row since Steve Stricker at the John Deere Classic in 2009, 2010 and 2011. 17 two-time defending champions have competed on TOUR since Stricker accomplished the feat, with six finishing in the top 10. The most recent attempt at a third win in a row was by Max Homa, who finished T7 in his bid at the 2023 Fortinet Championship. The 2022 WM Phoenix Open was the first of Scheffler's six career wins, which include the 2022 Masters Tournament and 2023 PLAYERS Championship.

Aon Swing 5: The Aon Next 10 and Aon Swing 5 are eligibility pathways for players, not already qualified, to play their way into Signature Events via the FedExCup standings. The top five players not otherwise exempt who earn the most FedExCup points during the Sony Open in Hawaii, The American Express, Farmers Insurance Open and WM Phoenix Open will qualify for The Genesis Invitational. The Aon Next 10 for The Genesis Invitational was determined through the FedExCup Fall standings.

44 players in the field have qualified for The Genesis Invitational (including World No. 19 Justin Thomas who will qualify as a PGA TOUR member in the top 30 of next week's Official World Golf Ranking). Those who are not exempt can qualify by earning a spot in the Aon Swing 5, winning the tournament, receiving a sponsor exemption and/or moving into the top 30 of the Official World Golf Ranking (if a PGA TOUR member).

56 players in the field competed at last week's AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, including three that finished in the top five; winner Wyndham Clark, Thomas Detry (T4) and Mark Hubbard (T4), Clark, who recorded a course-record 60 in the third round, earned his third PGA TOUR title at the event, which was shortened to 54 holes due to weather and safety concerns. His first two victories came last season (Wells Fargo Championship, U.S. Open) and with the victory. he tied Viktor Hovland for the most TOUR wins since May 1, 2023 (3).

Thomas Detry held at least a share of the 18- and 36-hole leads at last week's AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and went on to finish T4, his second career top-five on the PGA TOUR and first since finishing solo-second at the 2022. Butterfield Bermuda Championship. Detry, who has played in the final group during the third round in each of the last two weeks on TOUR (T20/Farmers Insurance Open, T4/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am), is not currently eligible for The Genesis Invitational (trails No. 5 Stephan Jaeger by 154,750 FedExCup points in the Aon Swing 5 standings).

Jake Knapp, who finished T3 at the Farmers Insurance Open to earn a spot in the field (WM Phoenix Open was the next Full-Field Event), enters the week No. 6 in the Aon Swing 5 standings, Knapp, a TOUR rookie, is making his eighth career PGA TOUR start and earned his TOUR card by finishing No. 13 in the Korn Ferry Tour Points List in 2023 (11 top-10 finishes in 2023).

ADDITIONAL STORYLINES

Sixth start in a row: Two players in the field have competed in all five TOUR events so far this season: 2023 PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year **Eric Cole** and **Tom Hoge**. Cole is making his tournament debut after not getting into the field during his rookie year (lost in a playoff at the Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches in his next start after not qualifying for the WM Phoenix Open and The Genesis Invitational), while Hoge is making his seventh appearance in the event (best result: T14/2022).

Arizona State graduate **Kevin Yu** qualified for the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (T58) at No. 4 in the Aon Swing 5 standings and is not yet qualified for The Genesis Invitational. Yu has two top-10s this season, earning them in consecutive starts for the first time in his TOUR career (T3/The American Express, T6/Farmers Insurance Open). In his second year on the PGA TOUR, the 2021 PGA TOUR University graduate is making his tournament debut at the WM Phoenix Open.

All 13 players who finished T10 or better at the 2023 WM Phoenix Open went on to finish in the top 50 in the FedExCup standings, qualifying for the BMW Championship and clinching a spot in all eight Signature Events in 2024. This includes runner-up **Nick Taylor**, who after finishing outside the top 125 in each of the previous two seasons, won the RBC Canadian Open and earned a spot in the TOUR Championship for the first time in his career (No. 24 in the 2022-23 FedExCup Playoffs and Eligibility Points List).

There have been 11 holes-in-one at TPC Scottsdale's iconic par-3 16th since the WM Phoenix Open moved to TPC Scottsdale in 1987. Most recently, there were two in 2022 (Sam Ryder/R3, Carlos Ortiz/R4).

Bud Cauley is making his first start on the PGA TOUR since the 2020 Fortinet Championship. Cauley entered the season on a Major Medical Extension with 27 starts available to earn 391.355 FedExCup points and match No. 125 from the 2020-21 FedExCup standings (Chesson Hadley/440.355). Cauley has recorded 23 top-10s in 185 career PGA TOUR starts (most recent: T4/2020 American Express).
