Playoff Notes

- Nick Taylor defeats Charley Hoffman with a birdie-3 on the second playoff hole (No. 18) to win the WM Phoenix Open
- 21st playoff in tournament history and the sixth in the last nine years
- Second playoff of the season (Sony Open in Hawaii)
- Playoff records: Taylor (2-0), Hoffman (1-3)

Nick Taylor (1st/-21)

- Picks up his fourth PGA TOUR win in his 260th start at the age of 35 years, 9 months, 28 days
- PGA TOUR wins (4): 2014 Sanderson Farms Championship, 2020 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, 2023 RBC Canadian Open, 2024 WM Phoenix Open
- Becomes the first player since Tony Finau at the 2023 Mexico Open at Vidanta to win an event the year after finishing runner-up; in 2023, finished two strokes behind champion Scottie Scheffler
- Joins George Knudson (1968) as Canadian winners of the WM Phoenix Open
- Collects 500 points and moves to No. 6 in the FedExCup standings
- Birdied five of his last six holes for the win (Nos. 15, 16 and 18 in regulation; No. 18 twice in the playoff)
- Improves to 2-for-2 when in converting a 54-hole lead/co-lead into victory (2020 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, 2024 WM Phoenix Open)
- Opened the week by tying the WM Phoenix Open 18-hole scoring record with a career-low 11-under 60
- Five-stroke lead after the first round tied Jim Gallagher, Jr. (1993 TOUR Championship) for the largest 18-hole lead in a stroke-play event on record (1983-present); broke the record for largest 18-hole lead at the WM Phoenix Open (Mickelson/4 strokes/2013); becomes the first 18-hole leader/co-leader to win the event since Rickie Fowler in 2019
- Improves to 2-for-4 when holding the 18-hole lead/co-lead (2019 Shriners Children’s Open/T29, 2020 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am/1st, 2022 Charles Schwab Challenge/T48, 2024 WM Phoenix Open/1st)
- Victory is his second top-10 finish in 10 starts at the WM Phoenix Open (2nd/2023, 1st/2024)

Aon Swing 5

- The top five players not otherwise exempt who earned the most FedExCup points during the Sony Open in Hawaii, The American Express, Farmers Insurance Open and WM Phoenix Open qualify for this week’s Genesis Invitational via the Aon Swing 5.

- Players who qualify through the Aon Swing 5 have until Monday at 5 p.m. ET of tournament week to commit to Signature Events. This category will always fill to five players, so if one of the eligible players does not commit, No. 6 in the standings will earn a spot. Matthieu Pavon does not intend to play The Genesis Invitational, so No. 6 (Justin Thomas) in the Aon Swing 5 standings is expected to qualify. Pavon will not be removed from the standings as he could commit before the deadline.

Miscellaneous Notes

- WM Ambassador and four-time PGA TOUR winner **Charley Hoffman** finishes runner-up for the 10th time in his 495th PGA TOUR start; the 47-year-old was attempting to become the oldest winner on TOUR since Phil Mickelson won the 2021 PGA Championship (50 years, 11 months, 7 days)
- World No. 1 **Scottie Scheffler** finishes T3 in bid to become the first player to win the same PGA TOUR event three years in a row since Steve Stricker at the John Deere Classic (2009-11)
- Seeking to win for the fourth straight season on TOUR, **Sam Burns** picks up his second straight top-10 finish at the WM Phoenix Open (T6/2023, T3/2024) and his third straight on TOUR (The American Express/T6, AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am/10th, WM Phoenix Open/T3)
- **Sahith Theegala** has held at least a share of the 36- and 54-hole leads two out of the last three seasons at the WM Phoenix Open (T3/2022, 5th/2024); falls to 1-for-4 when carrying the lead/co-lead into the final round on TOUR
- **Wyndham Clark**, winner of last week's AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, finishes T41
