Erik van Rooyen

- Made eagle at No. 18 in the final round to win the 2023 World Wide Technology Championship by two strokes, earning his second career PGA TOUR title
- With a win this week, would join Viktor Hovland (2020-21) as multiple winners of the event
- World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler is the only player to successfully defend a title on TOUR this season (THE PLAYERS Championship)
- Holds the last two wins on TOUR by a player from South Africa (2021 Barracuda Championship, 2023 World Wide Technology Championship)
- Making third start at the World Wide Technology Championship (MC/2022, Won/2023)
- Enters the week at No. 67 in the FedExCup Fall standings after qualifying for the FedExCup Playoffs for the first time since the 2020-21 season
- Four top-10s this season include a T2 finish at the Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches

Nico Echavarria

- Earned his second PGA TOUR victory at the 2024 ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP and first since the 2023 Puerto Rico Open; became the second player from Colombia with multiple victories on TOUR (Camilo Villegas/5)
- Last to win in back-to-back starts on TOUR: Rory McIlroy (2024 Zurich Classic of New Orleans, 2024 Truist Championship)
- Making second start at the World Wide Technology Championship (T31/2023)
- Enters the week at No. 65 in the FedExCup Fall standings; had one top-10 finish in 26 starts prior to his win this season (T4/Zurich Classic of New Orleans with Max Greyserman)

Camilo Villegas

- Finished runner-up at the 2023 World Wide Technology Championship while competing on a sponsor exemption and won the Butterfield Bermuda Championship in his next start, snapping a winless streak of 9 years, 2 months, 26 days (2014 Wyndham Championship)
- Has made 23 starts this season (best: T35/Masters Tournament); prior to a T54 in his last start at the Shriners Children's Open, had missed 12 of 13 cuts on TOUR
- Entered the 2023 World Wide Technology Championship at No. 223 in the FedExCup Fall standings and moved to No. 147 following his T2 finish
- Making his ninth start at the World Wide Technology Championship (best: T2/2023)
- Serving as PAC Chairman for the remainder of 2024 and will transition to the PGA TOUR Policy Board on January 1, 2025, serving a three-year term (2025-27) as one of six Player Directors (replacing Jordan Spieth)

Jhonattan Vegas

- Claimed his fourth career PGA TOUR title at the 2024 3M Open, which snapped a winless streak of 6 years, 11 months, 28 days (2017 RBC Canadian Open)
- Making his 12th career appearance at the World Wide Technology Championship (best: T10/2016)
- Coming off a T11 at the ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP, his best finish on TOUR this season, excluding his victory
- Enters the week No. 69 in the FedExCup Fall standings; qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs after not competing in a Signature Event in 2024

PGA TOUR season notes

- The FedExCup Fall is made up of eight events that crown PGA TOUR champions and finalize the top 125 and additional playing opportunities for the 2025 FedExCup Season. Nos. 1-50 in the FedExCup standings through the TOUR Championship are locked in their positions, while Nos. 51 and beyond carry their FedExCup points over and accumulate through The RSM Classic. Nos. 51-60 through the FedExCup Fall will qualify for two Signature Events in 2025: AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and The Genesis Invitational.
- Winners of events during the FedExCup Fall receive the same benefits of winners of Full Field Events during the Regular Season, including 500 FedExCup points, Official World Golf Ranking points, a two-year PGA TOUR exemption (exempt thru 2026) and invitations to The Sentry, THE PLAYERS Championship, Masters Tournament and PGA Championship.
- Although players in the top 50 are not earning FedExCup points, their points are not redistributed.
- The Top 125 will be exempt into all Full-Field Events and THE PLAYERS next season and Nos. 126-150 will earn full Korn Ferry Tour status and conditional status on TOUR
 - Players to move into the Top 125 following the ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP: Joel Dahmen (T41; No. 129 to No. 124)
 - Players to fall out of the Top 125 following the ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP: Joe Highsmith (DNP; No. 125 to No. 126)

World Wide Technology Championship notes

- The World Wide Technology Championship became the first official PGA TOUR event played in Mexico in the modern era when it debuted in 2007, and holds the distinction as the first official TOUR event played outside the U.S. or Canada
- This year marks the 18th playing of the event and the second time the tournament will be played at El Cardonal at Diamante
- Cameron Young is the highest-ranked player in the field at No. 33 in the Official World Golf Ranking; making his first start since the BMW Championship and has six top-10 finishes this season, including a runner-up at the Valspar Championship
- Five past World Wide Technology Championship winners are in the field: Harris English (2013), Charley Hoffman (2014), Patton Kizzire (2017), Matt Kuchar (2018), Erik van Rooyen (2023)
- Billy Andrade, who is competing on a sponsor exemption, will make his first start on the PGA TOUR since 2014 when he began playing on PGA TOUR Champions. This year marks the third time Andrade, who has four career PGA TOUR wins and three career Champions Tour wins, did not qualify for the Charles Schwab Cup Championship which is being played this week at Phoenix Country Club.
- Five winners on TOUR this season: Austin Eckroat (Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches), Harry Hall (ISCO Championship), Jhonattan Vegas (3M Open), Patton Kizzire (Procore Championship), Nico Echavarria (ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP)
- Latin American players in the field:
 - Mexico - Raul Pereda (Cordoba), Santiago De La Fuente (Ocotlan), Isidro Benítez (Puebla), Emilio Gonzalez (San Miguel d Allende), Omar Morales (Puebla)

- Scott Piercy will make his 14th start at the World Wide Technology Championship, the most of any active player on TOUR (next: 13/Charley Hoffman)
- Four players currently inside Nos. 51-60 in the FedExCup Fall are in the field; Nos. 51-60 in the final FedExCup Fall standings at the conclusion of The RSM Classic will serve as the Aon Next 10 for the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and The Genesis Invitational
