54-hole Lead Notes

• Three 54-hole co-leaders is the most on TOUR since five players shared the lead after the third round of the 2024 Texas Children's Houston Open (Alejandro Tosti, Thomas Detry, Stephan Jaeger/won, Scottie Scheffler, David Skinns)

Justin Lower (T1/-16)

- Would earn his first PGA TOUR title in his 94th start; age on Sunday: 35 years, 7 months, 6 days
- Recorded a bogy-free 9-under 63 in the third round, tying his career-best 18-hole score on TOUR (63/R1/2022 Procore Championship/finished T4)
- Second 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR and is 0-for-1 converting the victory (2022 Procore Championship/T4)
- Win would come in his third start at the World Wide Technology Championship (T56/2022, T23/2023)
- Enters the week at No. 95 in the FedExCup Fall standings and is projected No. 59

Carson Young (T1/-16)

- Would earn first PGA TOUR win in his 64th start; career-best T3 finish at the 2023 Puerto Rico Open
- Age on Sunday would be 29 years, 11 months, 29 days
- First 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR; previous-best position after 54 holes: 2nd (2023 Puerto Rico Open/finished T3)
- Win would mark second top-10 in three starts at the event (T53/2022, 9th/2023)
- Has two top-10s in 27 starts this season (T8/Mexico Open at Vidanta, T5/John Deere Classic)
- Enters the week at No. 113 in the FedExCup Fall standings and is projected No. 67

Justin Lower or Carson Young – with a victory

- Would join Brian Gay (2008), John Huh (2012) and Patton Kizzire (2017) as first-time winners of the event
- Would be the 14th first-time winner on TOUR this season and first since Matt McCarty (Black Desert Championship)

Nico Echavarria (T1/-16)

- Would earn his third PGA TOUR title in his 59th start; age on Sunday: 30 years, 3 months, 6 days
- Won the 2024 ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP in most recent start (first win: 2023 Puerto Rico Open)
- Would be the first player to win in back-to-back starts on TOUR since Rory McIlroy (2024 Zurich Classic of New Orleans, 2024 Truist Championship)
- Would become the seventh multiple winner on TOUR this season, joining Scottie Scheffler (7), Nick Dunlap (2), Robert MacIntyre (2), Hideki Matsuyama (2), Rory McIlroy (2), Xander Schauffele (2)
- Third career 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR; 2-for-2 to date converting to victory
- Held a two-stroke lead entering the final round of the ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP and went on to win

- Only player bogey-free through 54-holes; would become the first player since Tom Kim (2022 Shriners Children's Open) to play 72 holes without a bogey (or worse) and win
- Would become the fourth international winner (fifth instance) of the World Wide Technology Championship (most recent: Erik van Rooyen/2023/South Africa)
- Win would come in his second start at the World Wide Technology Championship (T31/2023)
- Projected to move from No. 65 to No. 51 in the FedExCup Fall points list with a victory
- Would be third top-10 finish in 28 starts this season: T4/Zurich Classic of New Orleans (with partner Max Greyserman), won/ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP

Miscellaneous notes

- **Joe Highsmith** (T4/-15) would be the fifth rookie to win on TOUR this season (sixth total win), joining Nick Dunlap (2), Matthieu Pavon, Jake Knapp, Matt McCarty
- In most recent start, Max Greyserman (T4/-15) recorded his third runner-up finish of the season at the ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP (3M Open, Wyndham Championship); with a win, would become the second player this season to finish runner-up and win the next tournament on the TOUR schedule, joining Davis Thompson (T2/Rocket Mortgage Classic, Won/John Deere Classic)
- Luke Donald (back injury) withdrew during the third round and Trace Crowe (personal) withdrew following his round

FedExCup Fall Notes

- Nos. 1-50 in the FedExCup standings through the TOUR Championship are locked in their positions, while Nos. 51 and beyond carry their FedExCup points into the Fall; Nos. 51-60 through the FedExCup Fall will qualify for two Signature Events in 2024: AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and The Genesis Invitational
- Currently projected to move into Nos. 51-60: **Nico Echavarria** (T1; from No. 65 to No. 51), **Justin Lower** (T1; from No. 95 to No. 59)
- Currently projected to fall out of Nos. 51-60: **Justin Rose** (DNP; from No. 58 to No. 61), Kevin Yu (DNP; from No. 59 to No. 62)
- The Top 125 will be exempt into all Full-Field events and THE PLAYERS next season and Nos. 126-150 will earn full Korn Ferry Tour status and conditional status on TOUR next season
- Currently projected to move into the Top 125: **Joe Highsmith** (T4; from No. 126 to No. 111), **Daniel Berger** (T9; from No. 129 to No. 119)
- Currently projected to fall out of the Top 125: S.H. Kim (MC; from No. 122 to No. 126), Matt Wallace (DNP; from No. 125 to No. 128)
