Pre-Tournament Notes - Wyndham Championship

TOUR season notes

- Since the inception of the FedExCup in 2007, the Wyndham Championship has played host to the FedExCup Regular Season finale (since 2008 at Sedgefield Country Club); players are seeking to secure their place inside the top 70 and a spot in the FedExCup Playoffs
- 21 of the 60 players who competed in last week's Men's Olympic Golf Competition are in the field, including six who enter the week between Nos. 61 and 90 in the FedExCup standings: **Min Woo Lee**/No. 61, **Emiliano Grillo**/No. 67, **Victor Perez**/No. 70, **Nicolai Højgaard**/No. 79, **Kevin Yu**/No. 86, **C.T. Pan**/No. 88

Wyndham Championship notes

- Strength of field: 25 (2024) vs. 18 (2023) players who finished in the previous year's top 50 in the FedExCup standings
- This year marks the 85th annual Wyndham Championship, having been included on the PGA TOUR schedule since 1938 (the seventh-longest running TOUR event excluding the majors)
- The Wyndham Championship winner will receive 500 FedExCup points, a two-year exemption on the PGA TOUR and \$1,422,000; the winner will also be exempt for The Sentry, THE PLAYERS Championship, Masters Tournament and PGA Championship in 2025

Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10

- The Wyndham Championship also serves as the final opportunity for players to secure their spot inside the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10, which rewards season-long performance for the top 10 players in the FedExCup standings at the conclusion of the FedExCup Regular Season
- The Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10 will share a \$40 million bonus, with the No. 1-ranked played earning \$8 million
- Two players in the field, **Sungjae Im** (No. 9) and **Shane Lowry** (No. 10), will look to solidify their position in the top 10, with Lowry seeking to advance to the TOUR Championship for the first time
- Four players in the field can play their way into the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10
 - Wake Forest, North Carolina resident Akshay Bhatia (currently No. 15) needs at least a solo-second or better to have a chance to move in
 - o Robert MacIntyre (No. 17), Brian Harman (No. 21) and Christiaan Bezuidenhout (No. 22) need a win to have a chance to move in

Top player notes

- The field includes:
 - Eight of the top 30 in the FedExCup standings, led by No. 9 Sungjae Im and No. 10 Shane Lowry
 - 21 of the top 50 in the Official World Golf Ranking, led by No. 15 Brian Harman, No. 16 Robert MacIntyre and No.
 20 Sungjae Im
 - o 78 PGA TOUR winners, led by 13-time winner Jordan Spieth
 - o 10 major champions, led by Spieth (3)
 - Nine past champions: Lucas Glover (2023), Kevin Kisner (2021), Jim Herman (2020), J.T. Poston (2019), Brandt Snedeker (2007, 2018), Si Woo Kim (2016), Camilo Villegas (2014), Webb Simpson (2011), Ryan Moore (2009)
- Lucas Glover seeks to become the first player to successfully defend his title at the Wyndham Championship since Sam Snead in 1956; with his win in 2023, became the third player in the FedExCup era (est. 2007) to enter the Wyndham Championship outside the bubble for the FedExCup Playoffs and win to get in (Davis Love III/2015, Jim Herman/2020)
- Matt Kuchar is the lone player who has qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs in each season since the inception of the FedExCup in 2007; he enters the week No. 111 on the FedExCup Playoffs and Eligibility Points List and needs a win to move into the top 70
- 2007 and 2018 Wyndham Championship winner Brandt Snedeker was announced Tuesday as the recipient of the 2024
 Payne Stewart Award presented by Southern Company; making his 16th start at the event

Bubble Notes

- No. 62 Jordan Spieth: 2015 FedExCup Champion will make his fourth career appearance at the Wyndham Championship (finished runner-up in 2013); in addition to a FedExCup Playoffs berth, Spieth is looking to secure exemptions into the Signature Events in 2025 by virtue of being inside the top 50 through the FedEx St. Jude Championship; Spieth has never missed the FedExCup Playoffs (12th season on TOUR)
- No. 65 Nick Dunlap: PGA TOUR rookie became the first player in PGA TOUR history to win as an amateur and a professional in the same season with wins at The American Express and Barracuda Championship; as an amateur at the time of his win at The American Express, Dunlap did not receive FedExCup points for the victory
- **No. 68 Jhonattan Vegas**: 3M Open winner collected his first title since the 2017 RBC Canadian Open after competing on a Major Medical Extension in 2024; seeks to return to the FedExCup Playoffs for the first time since the 2021-22 season
- **No. 70 Victor Perez:** One week after representing France in the 2024 Men's Olympic Golf Competition in Paris, Perez will look to secure his FedExCup Playoffs debut after earning his PGA TOUR card via the 2023 DP World Tour Top 10; has three top-10s in 19 starts on the season (T3/Puerto Rico Open, 3rd/RBC Canadian Open, T10/Genesis Scottish Open)
- **No. 71 Davis Riley:** Winner of the Charles Schwab Challenge, is the only player outside the top 70 in the FedExCup Playoffs and Eligibility Points List with a win in a Full Field event (500 FedExCup points) during the 2024 PGA TOUR Season
- No. 75 Lucas Glover: Defending champion moved 63 spots from No. 112 to No. 49 in the FedExCup with his win in 2023 and went on to claim the FedExCup Playoffs opener at the FedEx St. Jude Championship the following week; best finish in 20 starts this season came at the Valspar Championship (11th)
- **No. 79 Nicolai Højgaard:** 23-year-old first-year member seeks his FedExCup Playoffs debut after earning his PGA TOUR card through non-member FedExCup points; in 17 starts this season, has one top-10 finish (2nd/Farmers Insurance Open)
