Weather: Thursday: Tropical Storm Debby; heavy rains, flooding and windy conditions. High of 74. Wind E 15-20 mph, with gusts to 45 mph. Friday: Partly cloudy with isolated showers. High of 83. Wind WSW 10-15 mph. Saturday: Mostly cloudy. High of 81 in the morning. Wind N 3-6 mph.

Round summary: The first round was postponed to Friday due to Tropical Storm Debby. The round began at 9:50 a.m. ET Friday and was suspended due to darkness at 8:12 p.m. with 66 players left to finish the round. The round was scheduled to resume at 7 a.m. Saturday but did not resume until 8 a.m. due to wet course conditions. The round was completed at 10:29 a.m.

Beau Hossler (1st/-10)

- Career-low 60; previous low round on TOUR: 62, twice (most recent: R1/2023 Shriners Children's Open)
- 49th 60 on record (1983-present) and fourth this season; others: Nick Dunlap/The American Express/R3/won, Wyndham Clark/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am/R3/won, Nick Taylor/WM Phoenix Open/R1/won
- Sixth score of 60 or better this season, tied with 2016-17 for the most in a season on record (1983-present)
- Falls one shy of equaling the Wyndham Championship record of 59 set by Brandt Snedeker (R1) en route to winning in 2018
- Career-low 28 on the front nine, one shy of the tournament record held by Snedeker (2018/R1) and Tom Kim (2022/R4)
- Opens round birdie-birdie-birdie-eagle, becoming the first player in the ShotLink era to play opening five holes at the event in 6-under; marks the longest birdie-eagle streak in his TOUR career (5 holes)
- Fifth 18-hole lead/co-lead in stroke-play events on TOUR; 0-for-4 converting to victory
- Second 18-hole lead/co-lead of the season (Myrtle Beach Classic/finished T4); one of six players with multiple 18-hole lead/co-leads this season
- Was T1 with teammate Wyndham Clark after the first round of the 2023 Zurich Classic of New Orleans (finished third)
- Three first-round leaders/co-leaders have won the Wyndham Championship since it moved to Sedgefield Country Club in 2008 (most recent: Brandt Snedeker, 2018)
- Three 18-hole leaders/co-leaders have gone on to win stroke-play events this season (most recent: Xander Schauffele/PGA Championship)
- Seeking first TOUR win in his 198th start; most recent of three runner-up finishes came at the 2023 ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP
- Joined the PGA TOUR at the start of the 2017-18 season after graduating from the Korn Ferry Tour in 2017; making his 185th start since then, tied with Brian Stuard for the fourth-most of any player without a win in that span (209/Adam Schenk, 193/Sam Ryder, 191/Patrick Rodgers)
- Entered the week 87th in the FedExCup standings; needs a solo-third or better to have a chance to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs
- Making his fifth start at the Wyndham Championship, with a T65 in 2021 his lone made cut

- The Wyndham Championship is the final event of the FedExCup Regular Season, with the top 70 in the standings qualifying for next week's FedEx St. Jude Championship (the first FedExCup Playoffs event)
- 18-hole leader Beau Hossler is the only player projected to move inside the top 70
- Matt Kuchar posts 6-under 64 and needs a win to extend his streak as the only player to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs in each season since the inception of the FedExCup in 2007
- One week after representing France in the 2024 Men's Olympic Golf Competition, No. 70 **Victor Perez** posts a 4-under 66 in his tournament debut as he looks to advance to the FedExCup Playoffs in his first year as a TOUR member

Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10

- The Wyndham Championship serves as the final opportunity for players to secure their spot inside the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10, which rewards season-long performance for the top 10 players in the FedExCup standings at the conclusion of the FedExCup Regular Season; the group will share a \$40 million bonus, with the No. 1-ranked played earning \$8 million
- Two players in the field, **Sungjae Im** (No. 9) and **Shane Lowry** (No. 10), are looking to solidify their position in the top 10; Im opens with a 68, while Lowry cards a 70
- Four players can play their way into the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10: Akshay Bhatia (1-under 69) needs at least a solo-second or better to have a chance to move in, while Robert MacIntyre (2-under 68), Brian Harman (1-under 69) and Christiaan Bezuidenhout (even-par 70) need a win to have a chance to move in

Miscellaneous Notes

- **Billy Horschel** (2nd/-8) ties his career-low with a 62, matching his second-round score from the 2023 Wyndham Championship; Horschel holes out for eagle from 143 yards on No. 2, his first eagle on a par-4 on the PGA TOUR since the second round of the 2023 Wyndham Championship (No. 8)
- Harris English WD prior to the first round with a back injury, replaced by Kevin Tway
