Weather: Partly cloudy. High of 84. Wind WNE 4-8 mph.

Suspension/Resumption: Play was suspended Saturday due to darkness at 8:20 p.m. ET with 20 players left to complete the round. Round two resumed at 6:45 a.m. Sunday and was completed at 7:31 a.m.

36-Hole Cut: 66 professionals and one amateur at 4-under 136 from a field of 155 professionals and one amateur.

Third-round tee times: 7:50-9:40 a.m. ET in threesomes off Nos. 1 and 10; players will not be regrouped before the final round (second time this season; first: WM Phoenix Open)

Matt Kuchar (1st/-12)

- 16th career 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR; 3-for-15 to date converting to victory (wins: 2012 PLAYERS Championship, 2018 World Wide Technology Championship, 2019 Sony Open in Hawaii)
- First 36-hole lead/co-lead since the 2020 Genesis Invitational (finished T2)
- Only player to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs in each season since the inception of the FedExCup in 2007; entered the week No. 111 in the FedExCup standings and needs to win to have a chance of qualifying (currently projected to move to No. 57)
- Three players have entered the Wyndham Championship outside the bubble for the FedExCup Playoffs and won to get in (Davis Love III/2015, Jim Herman/2020, Lucas Glover/2023)
- Played in the final group in the final round at the 3M Open two weeks ago and went on to finish T3, earning his first top-10 of the season
- Nine-time PGA TOUR winner; most recent: 2019 Sony Open in Hawaii
- At age 46 years, 1 month, 22 days on Monday, would be the oldest winner on TOUR since Phil Mickelson at the 2021 PGA Championship (50 years, 11 months, 7 days)

FedExCup Playoffs Notes

- The Wyndham Championship is the final event of the FedExCup Regular Season, with the top 70 in the standings qualifying for next week's FedEx St. Jude Championship (the first FedExCup Playoffs event)
- 36-hole leader **Matt Kuchar** is the only player projected to move inside the top 70; Kuchar needs a win to extend his streak as the only player to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs in each season since the inception of the FedExCup in 2007
- One week after representing France in the 2024 Men's Olympic Golf Competition, **Victor Perez** (T25/-5) is the only player projected to fall out of the top 70 (70 to 71) as he looks to advance to the FedExCup Playoffs in his first year as a TOUR member
- Nos. 72-77 entering the week all missed the cut (Andrew Putnam, Kurt Kitayama, Luke List, defending champion Lucas Glover, Lee Hodges, Adam Schenk)

Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10

- The Wyndham Championship serves as the final opportunity for players to secure their spot inside the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10, which rewards season-long performance for the top 10 players in the FedExCup standings at the conclusion of the FedExCup Regular Season; the group will share a \$40 million bonus, with the No. 1-ranked player earning \$8 million

- Two players in the field entered the week inside the top 10: **Sungjae Im** (No. 9) and **Shane Lowry** (No. 10); Im (T25/-5) is projected to move to No. 8 and Lowry (MC) is projected to remain No. 10
- Two players can play their way into the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10 with a win: **Brian Harman** (T46/-4) and **Christiaan Bezuidenhout** (T46/-4); **Akshay Bhatia** and **Robert MacIntyre** had a chance to move into the top 10 and missed the cut

Miscellaneous Notes

- Rookie **Max Greyserman** (T2/-11) cards a 10-under 60, his career-low score on the PGA TOUR and tied for the low round of the week (Beau Hossler/R1); marks the 50th 60 carded on TOUR on record (1983-present)
- Rookie **Joe Highsmith** (MC) makes a hole-in-one at the par-3 12th, becoming the first player to make three holes-in-one in a single season since the TOUR began tracking hole-by-hole data in 1983; other holes-in-one this season: The American Express (R2/No. 13), Rocket Mortgage Classic (R2/No. 5)
- Defending champion **Lucas Glover** (MC) makes a hole-in-one at the par-3 12th, his sixth career hole-in-one on TOUR (tied for ninth-most since the TOUR began tracking hole-by-hole data in 1983)
- **C.T. Pan** WD during the second round due to a back injury
- **Aaron Baddeley** and **Parker Coody** WD after the suspension of the second round
