PGA TOUR rookie Max Greyserman (1st/-15)

- First career 54-hole lead/co-lead; previous-best 54-hole position in a stroke-play event on TOUR: T9 (2024 Puerto Rico Open/finished T15, 2024 Texas Children's Open/finished T7)
- Finished a career-best solo-second at the 3M Open in his most recent start
- Joined the PGA TOUR as a rookie at the start of the season after finishing No. 9 on the 2023 Korn Ferry Tour Points List
- Three top-10s in 21 prior starts during his rookie season (T7/Texas Children's Open, T4/Zurich Classic of New Orleans with partner Nico Echavarria, 2nd/3M Open)

Max Greyserman – with a win

- Would earn his first PGA TOUR title in his 23rd start; age on Sunday: 29 years, 2 months, 11 days (29 years, 2 months, 12 days on Monday)
- Could move as high as No. 30 in the FedExCup standings entering the FedExCup Playoffs
- Would be the second player this season to finish runner-up and win the next tournament on the PGA TOUR schedule (2nd/3M Open), joining Davis Thompson (T2/Rocket Mortgage Classic, Won/John Deere Classic)
- Would be the 11th first-time winner on TOUR this season and first since Harry Hall (ISCO Championship)
- Would be the fourth rookie to win on TOUR this season (fifth total win), joining Nick Dunlap (2), Matthieu Pavon and Jake Knapp

Amateur Luke Clanton (2nd/-13)

- 8-under 62, his career-low score in 21 rounds on TOUR
- Leads the PGA TOUR with three scores of 63 or better since making his TOUR debut at the 2024 U.S. Open 62, Wyndham Championship (R3)
 - 63, John Deere Classic (R4)
 - 63, John Deere Classic (R1)
- With a win, would be exempt on the PGA TOUR through 2026 upon turning professional; if he did not turn professional, would be eligible to compete in Full-Field Events and subject to non-member regulations
- Last player to win starting the final round on No. 10: Derek Lamely, 2010 Puerto Rico Open
- Cannot qualify for the 2024 FedExCup Playoffs (would not have earned any FedExCup points)
- As an amateur, cannot earn money (official or unofficial) nor non-member FedExCup points
- Official Money for his finishing position would be redistributed but FedExCup points are not (i.e., if Clanton finishes solosecond, a player finishing solo-third would earn second-place Official Money and third-place FedExCup points)
