Things to Know

- On the strength of a hole-out for an eagle-2 at No. 13, **Glen Day** opens with a 4-under 68 in his continued search for a first career victory on PGA TOUR Champions.
- In his bid for a first top-10 finish on PGA TOUR Champions, **Boo Weekley** adds a fifth birdie of the day on the last hole to claim a share of the lead at 4-under 68.
- Following a 1-over 37 on his outgoing nine holes, 2019 and 2021 champion **Jerry Kelly** reeled off five straight birdies on Nos. 11-15 to open his seventh American Family Insurance Championship in 3-under 69.
- In his bid for a sixth top-10 finish in his seventh American Family Insurance Championship start, defending champion and Tournament Host **Steve Stricker** opens with a 3-under 69.

Glen Day (T1/68/-4)

- Highlighted by an eagle-2 from 99 yards at No. 13, his 4-under 68 matches his low 18-hole score in 19 rounds in the American Family Insurance Championship
- Best of six previous starts in the event: T14/2016
- Remains in search of his first top-10 finish in his ninth start of the season
- Remains in search of his first PGA TOUR Champions victory in his 185th start; most recent of three runner-up finishes: 2020 Charles Schwab Series at Bass Pro Shops Big Cedar Lodge (*playoff loss*)
- Is 0-for-3 when holding an 18-hole lead/co-lead in 54 holes events on PGA TOUR Champions

Boo Weekley (T1/68/-4)

- With birdies on three of his first four holes, as well as No. 18, opens his first American Family Insurance Championship with a 4-under 68
- Previous best 18-hole position on PGA TOUR Champions was T6/2024 Invited Celebrity Classic (finished T12)
- Seeks a first top-10 finish in his 19th start on PGA TOUR Champions; best finish: T12/2024 Invited Celebrity Classic
- Making his 11th start of the season and comes off a T32 at last week's Principal Charity Classic

Additional Player Notes

- After making the turn in 1-over 37, Wisconsin native and 2019, 2021 champion **Jerry Kelly** made five consecutive birdies on Nos. 11-15 to open his seventh American Family Insurance Championship in 3-under 69 (T3); the score extends his streak of par-or-better rounds in the event to a perfect 19; in addition to his victories in 2019 and 2021, claimed additional top-5 finishes in 2018 (2nd) and 2022 (T3); seeks a 12th career win on PGA TOUR Champions and first since his 2022 playoff win at the Rogers Charity Classic.
- Coming off last week's T3 finish at the Principal Charity Classic, his first top-10 finish on PGA TOUR Champions,
 David Duval opened with a 3-under 69 (T3); In two previous starts at the American Family Insurance
 Championship, finished T54/2022 and T45/2023.
- Seeking a third top-10 in his eighth start in the event, **Duffy Waldorf** offset one bogey with four birdies to open with a 3-under 69 (T3); previous top-10 finishes: 4th/2019, T8/2016.
- En route to an even-par 72 (T30), **Kevin Sutherland** aced the par-3 fifth hole from 198 yards; in his most recent of three previous starts at the American Family Insurance Championship, finish T5 in 2019.
