**Today** – Partly cloudy skies can be expected this morning with temperatures warming into the low 80s. Scattered showers offshore will begin to move inland by midday/early afternoon with scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms continuing into the late afternoon. Heavy downpours will be possible, especially with thunderstorms. An ENE wind will increase to 10-15 mph as well.

**Extended forecast** – The east-northeast wind flow will continue Saturday with scattered coastal showers pushing inland during the afternoon hours. Showers and isolated thunderstorms will likely be more numerous compared to previous days as moisture increases over the region. The formation of a tropical depression will likely hold off until the middle of next week. However, moisture from the Gulf and the Atlantic will increase Sunday as a cold front moves into Southern Georgia. Showers and isolated thunderstorms will be likely through the day with heavy rainfall at times.
