Additional Notes

- All the bunkers were renovated this year under the direction of Andrew Green and went from 55 to 61 total bunkers. A new drainage system was installed, and new sand was added.
- Due to cooler weather the bermudagrass areas of the course have stopped growing.
- A rain event will take longer for the course to dry out due to the shorter days and lower sun angle.
