**Today** – A weak boundary will meander over the area today. Some showery activity is possible before 9:30am, otherwise partial clearing is expected to take place through the late morning hours. As daytime heating intensifies, the potential for shower/T-storm development exists between 1-5pm. This activity should remain spotty if it develops so only a 20-30% chance for showers/T-storms will be included in the forecast. Forecast rainfall: Less than 0.15". **Sunrise: 5:42am / Sunset: 8:42pm**

**Extended Forecast** — Quiet conditions will be in place tonight with partly cloudy skies overhead. A 30% chance for showers/T-storms will be maintained in the Sunday forecast, since some model guidance tries to push a complex of showers/T-storms into Iowa. Given environmental conditions in place, this complex would likely be weakening or completely diminishes as it approaches Des Moines. A higher threat for showers/T-storms likely develops Sunday night into early Monday morning.
