Things to Know

- Making his 10th start in the SAS Championship, **Billy Andrade** ties his low round of the season with a bogey-free 7-under 65; seeks a fourth PGA TOUR Champions victory and first in nine years.
- World Golf Hall of Fame member **Padraig Harrington** birdies five of his last nine holes en route to a bogey-free 6-under 66 in his third SAS Championship start.
- 2019 SAS Championship winner **Jerry Kelly** birdies his last four holes to sign for a 5-under 67 in his bid for a fifth top-10 finish in his seventh start in the event.

Billy Andrade (1st/-7)

- In search of a first top-10 in his 10th SAS Championship start, birdied three of his last four holes (Nos. 15-17) en route to a bogey-free 7-under 65.
- His 65 ties his low round of the season in relation to par from round three of the Principal Charity Classic (T31).
- Is 0-for-3 when attempting to convert an 18-hole lead/co-lead into victory in a 54-hole event on PGA TOUR Champions.
- Best finish in nine previous SAS Championships was T11 in 2018; posted a second-round 7-under 65.
- Seeks a second top-10 finish of the season in his 24th start (T6/DICK's Open).
- Seeks a fourth PGA TOUR Champions win; each of his previous three came in his second year on Tour of 2015.

Other Notes

- After opening with eight pars and one birdie on his outgoing nine, World Golf Hall of Fame member **Padraig Harrington** birdied five of his inward nine holes to open his third SAS Championship with a bogey-free 6-under 66 and claim solo possession of second place. Previous finishes in the event: T45/2023, T25/2022.
- Making his first start in the SAS Championship, Matt Gogel offset one bogey with six birdies to open with a 5-under 67 (T3); he remains in search of his first PGA TOUR Champions title in his 50th start this week; best of seven top-10 finishes: 5th/2023 Insperity Invitational; both top-10 finishes this season have come in his most recent five starts: T7/Shaw Charity Classic, T7/PURE Insurance Championship.
- 2019 SAS Championship winner Jerry Kelly birdied his last four holes, Nos. 15-18, to open with a 5-under 67, good for a share of third place; in six previous starts in the event, has finished inside the top six on four occasions and no worse than T19 (2023).

- Making his 101st start on PGA TOUR Champions and fourth in the SAS Championship, 2020 champion Ernie Els opened with 2-under 70 (T21) in his bid for a fourth consecutive top-10 finish in the event (T3/2023, T10/2022, 1st/2020); his 2-under 70 in round one extends his perfect stretch of sub-par rounds in the event to 10.
- In his bid to join **Bruce Lietzke** (2001-02) as players to successfully defend a SAS Championship title, **Rod Pampling** is T57 after opening with a 2-over 74.
- At the conclusion of the SAS Championship, the top 72 players in the Charles Schwab Cup standings will advance to the *Charles Schwab Cup Playoffs*, beginning at next week's Dominion Energy Charity Classic in Richmond, Virginia.
