• Seeking his second win in four starts, **K.J. Choi** opened with bogey-free 66 to take the first-round lead over a quartet of players at The Ally Challenge presented by McLaren.

K.J. Choi, 34-32 - 66 (-6)

- Matched his low 18-hole score of the 2024 season (57th round)
 - Carded 66 on four previous occasions this year
- This is his fifth time leading/co-leading after the first round on PGA TOUR Champions
 - Is 0-for-4 converting those into victories
- The 54-year-old seeks his third win on PGA TOUR Champions (83rd start)
 - Previous wins: 2021 PURE Insurance Championship; 2024 Senior Open Championship presented by Rolex
- Seeks his second win of the 2024 season (19th start)
 - o Previous win: Senior Open Championship presented by Rolex (July 25-28)
 - Would be his second win in his last four starts
 - o Entered the week No. 5 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings
- Looks to become the fifth multi-time winner of the 2024 season on PGA TOUR Champions
 - Would join Ernie Els (3), Stephen Ames (3), Richard Bland (2) and Padraig Harrington (2)
- Making his fifth appearance at The Ally Challenge, his best finish is T4 (2021)

Stewart Cink, 34-33 - 67 (-5)

- The 51-year-old seeks his first win on PGA TOUR Champions (10th start)
 - o Best finish: 3rd (2023 KitchenAid Senior PGA Championship); T3 (2024 Regions Tradition)
- Making his sixth start of the 2024 season, he has four top-10 finishes
 - Best finish of 2024: T3 (Regions Tradition)
 - o Entered the week No. 39 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings

Brett Quigley, 36-31 - 67 (-5)

- The 55-year-old seeks his third win on PGA TOUR Champions (102nd start)
 - Previous wins: 2020 Morocco Champions; 2023 Constellation FURYK & FRIENDS
- Making his 17th start of the 2024 season, his best finish is T18 (Trophy Hassan II)
- Making his fifth appearance at The Ally Challenge, he has two runner-up finishes
 - o T2 (2020); 2nd (2022)

Rod Pampling, 34-33 - 67 (-5)

- The 54-year-old seeks his third win on PGA TOUR Champions (107th start)
 - o Previous wins: 2021 Boeing Classic; 2023 SAS Championship
- Making his 19th start of the 2024 season, he has three top-10 finishes
 - Best finish of 2024: T3 (Principal Charity Classic)
- Making his fifth appearance at The Ally Challenge, he has three top-10 finishes
 - Best finish at The Ally Challenge: T4 (2020)

David Branshaw, 33-34 - 67 (-5)

- Was one of three open qualifiers for this event after shooting 67 on Tuesday at Spring Meadows Country Club
- With a win on Sunday, he would become the 15th open qualifier to win on PGA TOUR Champions
 - o Previous instance: Dicky Pride (2021 Mitsubishi Electric Classic)
- The 54-year-old seeks his first win on PGA TOUR Champions (48th start)
 - o Best finish: T6 (2023 Invited Celebrity Classic; 2023 Principal Charity Classic)
- Making his eighth start of the 2024 season, his best finish is T22 (Mitsubishi Electric Classic)

Other Notes

- 2021 champion **Joe Durant** is one of five players T6 at 4-under, along with **Greg Chalmers**, **Glen Day**, **Bob Estes** and **Jason Caron**.
 - Durant looks to become the fifth multi-time winner this season on PGA TOUR Champions after winning the Cologuard Classic (March 8-10). He would also become the first two-time winner in the seven-year history of The Ally Challenge.
 - Caron, a New England club professional, earned his way into this week's field by virtue of his top-10 finish
 (T3) at last week's Rogers Charity Classic.
 - o Chalmers, Day, Estes and Caron each seek their first win on PGA TOUR Champions.
- Charles Schwab Cup leader Ernie Els opened with 2-under 70 and sits T16.
