Things to Know

- First-round co-leader Hiroyuki Fujita carded 4-under 66 to take a one-stroke lead over fellow first-round coleader **Richard Green** into the weekend at the 44th U.S. Senior Open.
- **36-hole cut**: 71 players posted 2-over or better to make the cut from a field of 156 players.
- Saturday schedule change: Due to anticipated heavy fog on Saturday, third round tee times will run from 8-10 a.m. in threesomes off Nos. 1 and 10. Peacock will stream the action from 10 a.m.-Noon (ET) before NBC televises play from Noon-3 p.m. Golf Channel will broadcast a two-hour re-air of the third round from 3-5 p.m.

Hiroyuki Fujita, 63-66 - 129 (-11)

- The 55-year-old seeks his first win in a PGA TOUR Champions event (fifth start)
 - Best finish: T33 (2023 Senior Open Championship presented by Rolex)
- Is exempt into the 2024 U.S. Senior Open by finishing in the top 4 of the 2023 Japan Senior Tour money list
- Won the 2023 Japan Senior Open Golf Championship
- Making his second appearance in the U.S. Senior Open, he finished T47 in 2023
- Made 29 starts in PGA TOUR events, most recently in 2015
 - Best finish: T10 (2011 Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches)
- Has 16 wins on the Japan Golf Tour (621 starts)
 - o Last win: 2014 Asia-Pacific Diamond Cup Golf

Richard Green, 63-67 - 130 (-10)

- This is his low 36-hole score on PGA TOUR Champions (130)
 - o Previous best 36-hole score: 133 (2023 Charles Schwab Cup Championship)
- Matched his best 36-hole position on PGA TOUR Champions
 - o Previous instance: T2 (2023 Dominion Energy Charity Classic)
- The 53-year-old seeks his first win on PGA TOUR Champions (43rd start)
 - o Best finish: 2nd (2023 Dominion Energy Charity Classic; 2024 KitchenAid Senior PGA Championship)
- Making his 14th start of the 2024 season, he has three top-10 finishes and entered the week No. 9 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings
- Making his third appearance at the U.S. Senior Open, he has finished T49 (2022) and T27 (2023)

Steve Stricker, 66-66 - 132 (-8)

- The 57-year-old seeks his 18th win on PGA TOUR Champions (72nd start)
 - A win would move him into T14 on the all-time PGA TOUR Champions wins list
 - o Last win: 2023 Sanford International
- Seeks his eighth senior major title, which would move him into T3 on the all-time list
 - o Last senior major win: 2023 Kaulig Companies Championship
- Making his ninth start of the 2024 season, he has seven top-10 finishes and entered the week No. 4 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings
 - o Best finish of 2024: 2nd (American Family Insurance Championship)
- Making his fourth appearance at the U.S. Senior Open, he won in 2019 and finished runner-up in 2022 and 2023

Other Notes

- 51-year-old **Richard Bland**, who won the KitchenAid Senior PGA Championship last month, sits T3 at 8-under after shooting bogey-free 64.
- Charles Schwab Cup leader Stephen Ames sits in 5th at 7-under. The 60-year-old seeks his third win of the 2024 season on PGA TOUR Champions (14th start).
 - o Previous 2024 wins: Chubb Classic; Mitsubishi Electric Classic
- World Golf Hall of Fame member Retief Goosen sits T6 at 6-under along with Thomas Bjorn and Paul Stankowski.
- 2022 champion Padraig Harrington, who won last week's DICK'S Open, carded 71 and sits T16 at 3-under.
- 70-year-old **Jay Haas** (T24) shot his age for the second consecutive day with an even-par 70. He improves to 18-for-18 making the cut at the U.S. Senior Open.
- Mark Hensby carded the low round of the day with 7-under 63 to move from T109 to T24 on the leaderboard after opening with 75.
- Two-time champion (2010, 2023) **Bernhard Langer** sits T60 at 2-over after carding 72. He improves to 15-for-16 making the cut at the U.S. Senior Open.
- Frank Bensel Jr. (CUT) made holes-in-one on back-to-back holes (Nos. 4 and 5), becoming the first player to ace consecutive holes on any PGA TOUR-sanctioned Tour since hole sequence tracking began with the inception of ShotLink in 2003.
 - He used a 6-iron on both holes, with No. 4 measuring 173 yards and No. 5 measuring 202 yards.
 - It is the only instance since 2003 where a player made two holes-in-one in the same round of a PGA TOUR Champions event.
- Mike Weir withdrew during the second round.
