THIS WEEK ON TOUR

- Following a one-week break, the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour season continues with the AdventHealth Championship, the 11th event on the Tour's 26-event schedule.
- This year marks the 15th playing of the AdventHealth Championship, with Blue Hills Country Club serving as the host venue since 2019.
- Harry Higgs won the 2024 AdventHealth Championship in dramatic fashion, holing
 out for eagle from 63 yards on the final hole of regulation to force a playoff with
 Davis Shore. Higgs won the sudden-death playoff with a birdie on the first playoff
 hole, the par-5 18th, for his second Korn Ferry Tour title. Higgs won the Visit Knoxville
 Open a week later, thus securing his return to the PGA TOUR. Higgs, who previously
 graduated from the Korn Ferry Tour at the end of the 2019 season, lost a playoff at
 last week's ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic in a bid for his first PGA TOUR win.
- Four of the nine players who finished T8 or higher at the 2024 AdventHealth Championship earned PGA TOUR membership at season's end, including PGA TOUR winner Matt McCarty (T4).
- Sepp Straka, winner of the 2018 AdventHealth Championship, earned his fourth career PGA TOUR win at last week's Truist Championship and rose to No. 9 in the Official World Golf Ranking. Straka followed Rory McIlroy as the second player with multiple victories on TOUR this season, as he previously won The American Express in January. Straka played the 2017 and 2018 seasons on the Korn Ferry Tour, earning PGA TOUR membership upon conclusion of the latter season.

2025 KEY STORYLINES

- Hank Lebioda stands atop the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, leading Johnny Keefer by just under six points through the first 10 events. Lebioda has held the No.1 spot since winning the season-opening event, The Bahamas Golf Classic at Atlantis Paradise Island. Lebioda leads the Tour with five top-10s, while Keefer is one of three players with four top-10s (Davis Chatfield, Mitchell Meissner).
- Korn Ferry Tour rookie Johnny Keefer won the 2025 Veritex Bank Championship, a victory which vaulted him into the top 100 of the Official World Golf Ranking. Keefer, who finished No. 1 in the 2024 Fortinet Cup standings on PGA TOUR Americas after he finished No. 25 in the 2024 PGA TOUR University Ranking (the final spot in the ranking which awarded performance benefits), is making his major championship debut at this week's PGA Championship and stands No. 93 in the OWGR.
- Bryson Nimmer won the most recent Korn Ferry Tour event, the Tulum Championship at PGA Riviera Maya, after he entered the week at No. 163 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List and was without a finish higher than T53 in his three previous starts this season.
- Korn Ferry Tour rookie Neal Shipley won the 2025 LECOM Suncoast Classic and is
 one of three rookie winners on Tour this season. Shipley is also one of eight firsttime winners this season, as well as one of seven winners under the age of 30,
 with the youngest among them being Sudarshan Yellamaraju (23 years old upon
 winning The Bahamas Great Abaco Classic at The Abaco Club).
- Kansas State University alum Jeremy Gandon earned his first Korn Ferry Tour title
 at the Club Car Championship at The Landings & Athletic Club, following three-time
 Korn Ferry Tour winner Paul Barjon as the second player from France to win on Tour.
- Justin Suh, the 2022 Korn Ferry Tour Player of the Year, returned to the winner's circle with a five-stroke victory at the 118th VISA Argentina Open presented by Macro. The win earned Suh an exemption for the 153rd Open Championship at Royal Portrush this July. Suh's only previous Korn Ferry Tour win came at the 2022 Korn Ferry Tour Championship presented by United Leasing & Finance.
- Three-time Korn Ferry Tour graduate Josh Teater overcame a six-stroke deficit in
 the final round of The Panama Championship to earn his second career Korn Ferry
 Tour victory. Teater, whose previous win came at the 2009 Utah Championship,
 ended the second-longest drought between victories in Korn Ferry Tour history (15
 years, 4 months, 20 days). Teater began the 2025 season in the "Veteran Member"
 category and secured fully exempt status for the remainder of the season.

Korn Ferry Tour Finals refers to the final four events of the 26-event season, where players will compete for increased purses and points (600 points for winning a Finals event, compared to 500 for winning one of the 22 preceding events) to determine the season-long points race. The total purse for each of the first 22 events is \$1 million (\$180,000 to the winner) and increases to \$1.5 million (\$270,000 to the winner) for the four Korn Ferry Tour Finals events.

TOURNAMENT STORYLINES

- The field includes 16 PGA TOUR winners who have combined for 29 career victories, highlighted by Scott Piercy with four PGA TOUR titles.
- Field includes 56 Korn Ferry Tour winners with 81 total wins, led by four-time winner D.A. Points.
 Nine of the 10 winners from this season are in the field, with the exception being Johnny Keefer, who is making his major championship debut this week at the PGA Championship.
- Zecheng Dou, winner of the 2017 AdventHealth Championship, is the only past champion of the
 event in this week's field. Dou later added Korn Ferry Tour titles at the 2019 The Bahamas Golf
 Classic and 2022 Ascendant presented by Blue.
- Five players in this week's field are inside the top 200 of the Official World Golf Ranking: No. 123 Kensei Hirata, No. 133 Neal Shipley, No. 164 S.H. Kim, No. 173 Pierceson Coody, and No. 194 Hank Lebioda.
- Seven players in the field have ties to the state of Kansas or Missouri, including Kansas City resident and University of Kansas alum Harry Hillier, who stands No. 65 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List.
