## Emilio González (1st/-22)

- With his first Korn Ferry Tour title, becomes the fourth member to earn a #TOURBound declaration, as he
  moves to No. 4 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List and effectively secures one of 20 PGA TOUR cards
  available through the Points List
- Follows No. 1 Johnny Keefer, No. 2 Austin Smotherman, and No. 3 Neal Shipley as the fourth Korn Ferry Tour member to earn a #TOURBound declaration and secure PGA TOUR membership for the 2026 season
- Earns his first Korn Ferry Tour title at 27 years, 9 months, 27 days of age
- Becomes the 15th first-time winner and seventh international winner of the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour season
- Sixth player representing Mexico to win on the Korn Ferry Tour, and the first Korn Ferry Tour winner from Mexico since Roberto Díaz/2021 Chitimacha Louisiana Open
- Closes in 10-under 61, the low round of the week, becoming the fourth player in Korn Ferry Tour history to card a score of 61 or lower in the final round and win a 72-hole tournament (Chris Couch/60/2005 Rheem Classic, Kyle Reifers/61/2006 Chattanooga Classic, Peter Tomasulo/61/2010 Ford Wayne Gretzky Classic)
- Finished No. 49 on the 2024 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, earning fully exempt status for the 2025 season
- Previously finished No. 172 on the 2023 Korn Ferry Tour Points List as a rookie, though he missed significant time in the middle of the season due to injury and was awarded a medical extension to begin the 2024 season
- Earned Korn Ferry Tour membership for the first time via a T24 finish at Final Stage of the 2022 Korn Ferry Tour Qualifying Tournament (now known as PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry)
- Played the 2020-21 and 2022 seasons on PGA TOUR Latinoamerica
- Played four seasons at St. Mary's University (2016-20), an NCAA Division II program in San Antonio, Texas, where he earned seven collegiate victories, including the 2018 Ryan Palmer Foundation Invitational

## **Additional Notes**

- Jeffrey Kang (2nd/-21), one of three 54-hole co-leaders, records his second runner-up finish of the season (NV5 Invitational) and projects to rise from No. 28 to No. 16 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List; he has four top-10s this season, three of which are top-three finishes (T3/Visit Knoxville Open), after he entered 2025 with two top-10s in 30 career starts on Tour
- Korn Ferry Tour winner **Adrien Dumont de Chassart** (T3/-20), one of three 54-hole co-leaders, records his first top-three finish on Tour since winning the 2023 BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by TD SYNNEX and finishing as a co-runner-up (in a playoff) at the 2023 Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Kansas Wichita Open in his first two professional starts
- Two-time PGA TOUR winner and Korn Ferry Tour winner **Russell Knox** (T3/-20), one of three 54-hole co-leaders, posts his third top-three finish of the 2025 season (The Bahamas Great Abaco Classic at The Abaco Club/T2, Club Car Championship at The Landings Golf & Athletic Club/T3)
- **Ryan Burnett** (T5/-19) records a career-high finish in what was his 32nd career start on Tour (previous: 2023 Price Cutter Charity Championship presented by Hiland Dairy Foods/6th)
- Upon conclusion of this week's Albertsons Boise Open presented by Chevron, the top 156 players on the 2025
   Korn Ferry Tour Points List qualify for the Simmons Bank Open for the Snedeker Foundation, the first of four season-ending Korn Ferry Tour Finals events
  - Two players who began the week outside the top 156 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List project to move into the top 156:
    - **Bio Kim** (T33/-13) No. 161 (projected No. 147)
    - Ian Gilligan (T40/-12) No. 165 (projected No. 153); finished No. 4 in 2025 PGA TOUR University Ranking
