Rick Lamb (1st/-8)

- Cards an opening round bogey-free 8-under 62 on the Pacos course, matching his career-low 18-hole score (2025 The Bahamas Golf Classic at Atlantis Paradise Island/R1; 2024 LECOM Suncoast Classic/R2; 2021 Memorial Health Championship presented by LRS/R1;)
- Third 18-hole lead/co-lead of his Korn Ferry Tour Career in what is his 129th start
- Making fifth career start at Astara Golf Championship presented by Mastercard; owns three made cuts in four previous starts with his best finish coming in the form of a T49 (2023)
- Finished No. 74 on the 2024 Korn Ferry Tour Points List to earn fully exempt status for the 2025 season
- Made 15 cuts in 22 starts last season on Tour with four top-10 finishes
- Defeated Dominic Bozzelli, Rhein Gibson and C.T. Pan in a playoff to capture his first career Korn Ferry Tour victory at the 2016 LECOM Health Challenge, an event he open-qualified into
- Finished No. 24 in the 2016 Korn Ferry Tour Regular Season money list to earn his first PGA TOUR card for the 2016-17 season

- Made 34 starts on the PGA TOUR with 13 made cuts, including a podium finish at the 2017 John Deere Classic (T3)
- Transferred to the University of Tennessee (2011-13) after two seasons at Santa Clara University (2009-2011); Named an All-American in 2013 at Tennessee and finished runner-up at the 2013 NCAA Championships as a senior

Additional Player Notes

- 23-year-old Colombian amateur **Esteban Jaramillo** (T2/-7), who is competing as a sponsor exemption this week, matches the lowest round by an amateur in a Korn Ferry Tour event with a 7-under 63 (last: Zachary Olsen/2017 Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Kansas Wichita Open/R4) and cards the lowest round by an amateur at the Astara Golf Championship (previous: Daniel Faccini/65/2024/R2)
- Two-time PGA TOUR winner Fabián Gómez (T2/-7) posts a 7-under 63, matching his lowest opening-round score in any PGA TOUR-sanctioned event (2023 BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by TD SYNNEX; 2009 BMW Charity Pro-Am)
- James Nicholas (T4/-6), who is making his second career start at the Astara Golf Championship, turns in the low round of the day at the Lagos course with a 6-under 65; highlighted by an eagle on the par-5 18th
- Two-time Korn Ferry Tour winner **Roger Sloan** (T4/-6) stands inside the top five after 18 holes of play for the first time since the 2018 UNC Health Championship presented by STITCH (T1/finished T10)
- First-year member **Harry Hillier** (T4/-6), who earned Korn Ferry Tour membership for the first time with a No. 7 finish in the 2024 PGA TOUR Americas Fortinet Cup, records the lowest round of his career with 6-under 64 in what is his fifth start on Tour
- Colombian **Ricardo Celia** (T12/-5), who finished T32 at last season's Astara Golf Championship, made birdie on five of his final six holes (Nos. 4, 5, 6, 7, 8) en route to a 5-under 65
