Myles Creighton (1st/-17)

- Second-year Korn Ferry member claims first career victory at 17-under 264 in 41st career start (previous best: 2nd/2024 Veritex Bank Championship)
- Posted a 2-under 68 in the final round, highlighted by an eagle on the par-4 11th
- Carded an 18-hole career-low 11-under 59 in the third round to become the 15th player in Tour history to record a sub-60 round
 - Made 12 birdies (Nos. 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 10, 13, 14, 15, 16) against one bogey (No. 8), becoming the 13th player in Tour history to record 12 birdies in a single round
- Becomes only the third player in Korn Ferry Tour history to record a sub-60 round and go on to win the tournament, joining Stephen Jaeger (12-under 58/2016 Ellie Mae Classic at TPC Stonebrae/R1) and Jason Gore (12-under 59/2005 Nike Omaha Classic/R2)
- Made two eagles during his second round with a hole-in-one on the par-3 12th and a hole out on the par-4
 15th for a 2-under 68, moving him inside the 3-under 137 cutline to make the weekend at 4-under 136
- Eighth 54-hole leader/co-leader to win on Tour this season; 17th to win the Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Kansas Wichita Open Benefitting KU Wichita Pediatrics
- Becomes the second Canadian to win on Tour this season, joining Sudarshan Yellamaraju (The Bahamas Great Abaco Classic at The Abaco Club), and the fifth international winner along with Pontus Nyholm (Sweden/Visit Knoxville Open), S.H. Kim (South Korea/AdventHealth Championship) and Jeremy Gandon (France/Club Car Championship at The Landings Golf & Athletic Club)
 - 21st Canadian to win on the Korn Ferry Tour, 31st occurrence
- Finished No. 45 on the 2024 Korn Ferry Tour Points List as a rookie behind four top-25s and three top-10s, highlighted by a runner-up finish at the Veritex Bank Championship

• Finished No. 2 in the 2023 PGA TOUR Lationamérica Order of Merit behind five top-10s and a win at the Inter Rapidisimo Golf Championship, earning conditional membership for the 2024 Korn Ferry Tour season

Additional Notes

- Mexico's Emilio Gonzalez (2nd/-16) cards a final round 4-under 66 to record his third consecutive top-10 finish, fourth overall, and the best finish of his career on Tour (previous best: T3/Simmons Bank Open for the Snedeker Foundation); Gonzalez had only two top-10s in 25 starts during the 2024 season
- Three-time Korn Ferry Tour winner Pierceson Coody (3rd/-15) finishes inside the top five for a second consecutive event and the third time this season (T2/BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by TD SYNNEX; T2/Astara Golf Championship presented by Mastercard)
- 54-hole co-leader **Quade Cummins** (4th/-14), who was a class of 2024 Korn Ferry Tour graduate, cards a 1-over 71 in the final round to log his best finish at the Wichita Open in his fifth start at the event (previous best: T38/2024)
- Class of 2023 Korn Ferry Tour graduate **Adrien Dumont de Chassart** (T5/-13), who opened the tournament with an 11-under 59, cards a final-round 5-under 65 and posts his best finish of the 2025 campaign (previous best: T8/UNC Health Championship presented by STITCH)
- **Mitchell Meissner** (T5/-13), who finished No. 47 on the 2024 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, logs his sixth top 10 of the season, matching Hank Lebioda for the most on Tour
- Conditional member **Billy Tom Sargent** (T7/-12) cards a final-round 2-under 68 to clinch the best finish of his career (previous best: T12/2023 Wichita Open)
 - Sargent earns a start at next week's Memorial Health Championship presented by LRS with a second consecutive top-25 finish; earned a spot in this week's field with a T24 at the BMW Charity Pro-Am
- Former Auburn Tiger Brendan Valdes (T13/-9), who finished No. 2 in the 2025 PGA TOUR University Ranking, posts an even-par 70 final round for his first top-25 finish in his second start as a professional
- Will Cannon (T23/-7), who finished No. 6 in the 2024 PGA TOUR Americas Fortinet Cup, records his second consecutive top 25 and earns a start at next week's Memorial Health Championship
- Dumont de Chassart's first-round 11-under 59 and Creighton's third-round 11-under 59 marked the second time in Korn Ferry Tour history in which multiple sub-60 rounds were recorded during the same event (2024 Astara Golf Championship, Cristobal Del Solar/13-under 57/R1; Aldrich Potgieter/11-under 59/R2)
