**Adrien Dumont de Chassart (1st/-20)**

- At 20-under 122 records the lowest opening 36-hole score in Korn Ferry Tour history, breaking a record previously established by Stephan Jaeger (123/2016 Ellie Mae Classic)
  - Matches the Korn Ferry Tour record for the lowest 36-hole score for any consecutive round; The record was established by Johnny Keefer earlier this season (19-under 122/2025 Astara Golf Championship presented by Mastercard/Rounds 2 and 3)
- Cards a second consecutive 10-under 61, playing the second round bogey-free with eight birdies (Nos. 2, 4, 5, 10, 11, 12, 15, 18) and an eagle (No. 16)
- Held one 36-hole lead in 30 previous starts on the Korn Ferry Tour; 2023 Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Kansas Wichita Open Benefitting KU Pediatrics (finished T3)
- Recorded the 14th sub-60 round in Korn Ferry Tour history at the 2025 Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Kansas Wichita Open, where he posted an 11-under 59 in the first round and eventually finished T5
- Finished No. 139 in the 2024 FedExCup Fall as a PGA TOUR rookie, leaving him with conditional TOUR status for the 2025 season
- Class of 2023 Korn Ferry Tour graduate who finished No. 11 on the 2023 Korn Ferry Tour Points List to earn PGA TOUR membership for the first time (top 30 earned TOUR membership); additionally earned 2023 Korn Ferry Tour Rookie of the Year honors off the strength of six top-10s and a win (BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by TD SYNEX) in 11 starts
- Finished No. 3 in the 2023 PGA TOUR University Ranking after five seasons at University of Illinois (2018-23), where he was a three-time Big Ten Conference Player of the Year (2021, 2022, 2023) and earned four

collegiate victories, with the crown jewel being individual co-medalist honors at the 2019 Big Ten Championship

#### Additional Notes

- Korn Ferry Tour winner **Pontus Nyholm** (T2/-16), who stands No. 17 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, logs a new 36-hole career-low score at 16-under 126, following rounds of 62 – 64 (previous best: 129, twice: 2022 Utah Championship presented by Zions Bank and Intermountain Health; 2024 Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Kansas Wichita Open)
- 18-year-old **Blades Brown** (T2/-16), who stands No. 72 on the Korn Ferry Tour Points List, cards the low round of the day and a career-best 11-under 60 (previous best: 10-under 61/2025 Veritex Bank Championship/Round 1) and establishes a new career-high 36-hole position (previous: 5th/2025 Utah Bank Championship presented by Zions Bank and Intermountain Health/finished T7)
- Three-time Korn Ferry Tour winner **Zecheng Dou** (T2/-16) stands inside the top five through 36 holes for a second consecutive event; entered the third round of the Nationwide Children’s Hospital Championship in fifth (finished T2)
- **Marcelo Roza** (T5/-15), who stands No. 54 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, stands inside the top five through 36 holes for the third time this season (T5/Tulum Championship at PGA Riviera Maya/finished T29; T5/The Ascendant Presented by Blue/finished T37)
- **Will Cannon** (T7/-14), who stands No. 77 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, cards a career-low bogey-free 9-under 62, eclipsing his previous record of 63 (three times, last: 2025 Nationwide Children’s Hospital Championship/Round 2)
- First-round leader **Davis Chatfield** (T10/-13), who stands No. 9 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, follows up his opening round 12-under 59 – the 16th sub-60 round in Tour history – with a 1-under 70
- Korn Ferry Tour rookie **Rayhan Thomas** (T16/-7), who is an Oklahoma State University alum, stands inside the top 10 after 36 holes for the second time this season (T2/Astara Golf Championship presented by Mastercard/finished T26)
- **Billy Tom Sargent** (T28/-10), who stands No. 88 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, climbs 71 positions on the leaderboard to move inside the cut line with an 18-hole career-low 10-under 61 after opening with an even-par 71
- The 36-hole cut was made at 7-under 135, tying the second-lowest 36-hole cut score (both in terms of total score and score relative to par) in Korn Ferry Tour history; marks the sixth occurrence in which the 36-hole cut total score was 135 and the ninth occurrence in which the 36-hole cut score relative to par was made at 7-under (most recent: 2025 NV5 Invitational)
- Upon conclusion of this week’s Compliance Solutions Championship, the top 75 players on the Korn Ferry Tour Points List will qualify for the Korn Ferry Tour Championship presented by United Leasing & Finance, the last of four season-ending Korn Ferry Tour Finals events
- Four of the 26 players who began the week outside the top 75 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List and made the 36-hole cut are projected to move inside the top 75
  - No. 76 **Samuel Anderson** (T7/-14) – projected No. 66
  - No. 77 **Will Cannon** (T7/-14) – projected No. 68
  - No. 78 **James Nicholas** (T15/-12) – projected No. 72
  - No. 79 **Cole Hammer** (T22/-11) – projected No. 75
