Adrien Dumont de Chassart (1st/-27)

- Follows up two consecutive 10-under 61s with a 7-under 64, totaling 27-under 186, recording the lowest 54-hole score in Korn Ferry Tour history (previous: 187/Stephen Jaeager/2016 Ellie Mae Classic)
- Recorded the lowest opening 36-hole score in Korn Ferry Tour history at 20-under 122, breaking a record previously established by Stephan Jaeger (123/2016 Ellie Mae Classic)
 - Matches the Korn Ferry Tour record for the lowest 36-hole score for any consecutive round; The record was established by Johnny Keefer earlier this season (19-under 122/2025 Astara Golf Championship presented by Mastercard/Rounds 2 and 3)
- Seven-stroke lead marks the largest 54-hole lead on Tour this season (previous: S.H. Kim/led by five strokes/AdventHealth Championship/won) and matches the second largest 54-hole lead in Korn Ferry Tour history (eighth occurrence; last: John Pak/2024 Compliance Solutions Championship/won)
 - In eight previous occurrences, only once has a 54-hole leader not gone on to win when leading by seven strokes or more (Parker McLachlin/led by seven strokes/2007 National Mining Association Pete Dye Classic/finished T4)
- Marks third 54-hole lead/co-lead of his Korn Ferry Tour career (2023 Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Kansas Wichita Open/finished T2; 2025 Albertsons Boise Open presented by Chevron/finished T3)
- Recorded the 14th sub-60 round in Korn Ferry Tour history at the 2025 Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Kansas Wichita Open, where he posted an 11-under 59 in the first round and eventually finished T5
- Finished No. 139 in the 2024 FedExCup Fall as a PGA TOUR rookie, leaving him with conditional TOUR status for the 2025 season
- Class of 2023 Korn Ferry Tour graduate who finished No. 11 on the 2023 Korn Ferry Tour Points List to earn PGA TOUR membership for the first time (top 30 earned TOUR membership); additionally earned 2023 Korn

- Ferry Tour Rookie of the Year honors off the strength of six top-10s and a win (BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by TD SYNNEX) in 11 starts
- Finished No. 3 in the 2023 PGA TOUR University Ranking after five seasons at University of Illinois (2018-23), where he was a three-time Big Ten Conference Player of the Year (2021, 2022, 2023) and earned four collegiate victories, with the crown jewel being individual co-medalist honors at the 2019 Big Ten Championship

Additional Notes

- Korn Ferry Tour winner **Chandler Blanchet** (T17/-16) becomes the seventh player of the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour season to achieve #TOURBound status; Blanchet secured his first PGA TOUR card for the 2026 season following a made cut at this week's Compliance Solutions Championship
- **S.T. Lee** (T2/-20), who stands No. 16 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, cards a career-low 9-under 62 (previous best: 7-under 63/UNC Health Championship presented by STITCH/Round 2) and establishes a new career-high 54-hole position (previous: T3/Astara Golf Championship presented by Mastercard/finished T6)
- Marcelo Rozo (T2/-20), who entered the week No. 54 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, stands inside the top five through 54 holes for the first time since 2022 The Bahamas Golf Classic at Atlantis Paradise Island (T5/finished T6)
- Rookie **Berend Botha** (T4/-19), who earned Korn Ferry Tour membership for the first time with a No. 4 finish in the 2024 PGA TOUR Americas Fortinet Cup, establishes a new high 54-hole position (previous best: T8/2025 Astara Golf Championship presented by Mastercard/finished T13)
- 18-hole leader **Davis Chatfield** (T4/-19), who carded a 12-under 59 in the first round, stands inside the top five through 54 holes for the seventh time this season; converting all into top 25 finishes with four top-10s (most recent: T3/NV5 Invitational/finished T3)
- **Zecheng Dou** (T4/-19), who is a three-time Korn Ferry Tour winner, stands inside the top five through 54 holes for the second event in a row, bidding for a second consecutive top five finish (T4/Nationwide Children's Hospital Championship/finished T2)
- Two-time Korn Ferry Tour winner **Johnny Keefer** (T9/-17), who stands atop the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, is the only winner from the 2025 season inside the top 10
- Upon conclusion of this week's Compliance Solutions Championship, the top 75 players on the Korn Ferry
 Tour Points List will qualify for the Korn Ferry Tour Championship presented by United Leasing & Finance, the
 last of four season-ending Korn Ferry Tour Finals events
- Two of the 26 players who began the week outside the top 75 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List and made the 36-hole cut are projected to move inside the top 75
 - O No. 76 Samuel Anderson (T9/-17) projected No. 68
 - o No. 78 James Nicholas (T9/-17) projected No. 69
