**Adrien Dumont de Chassart (1st/-33)**

- Cards a final round 6-under 65 to capture his second Korn Ferry Tour title, becoming the eighth player of the 2025 season to earn a #TOURBound declaration, moving to No. 6 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, effectively securing one of 20 PGA TOUR cards available through the Points List
- Four-round total of 33-under 251 marks the lowest 72-hole score relative to par in Korn Ferry Tour history, surpassing the previous record established by Tim Widing at the 2024 Veritex Bank Championship (31-under 253)
  - Marks the second-lowest 72-hole score in Tour history; Stephan Jaeger established the record (250) at the 2016 Elie Mae Classic
- Logged the lowest 54-hole score in Korn Ferry Tour history at 27-under 186 (previous: 187/Stephen Jaeager/2016 Ellie Mae Classic)
- Recorded the lowest opening 36-hole score in Korn Ferry Tour history at 20-under 122, breaking a record previously established by Stephan Jaeger (123/2016 Ellie Mae Classic)
  - Matches the Korn Ferry Tour record for the lowest 36-hole score for any consecutive round; The record was established by Johnny Keefer earlier this season (19-under 122/2025 Astara Golf Championship presented by Mastercard/Rounds 2 and 3)
- Becomes the 16th player in Tour history to win by seven or more strokes (last: Isaiah Salinda/won by eight strokes/2024 Panama Championship)
- Improves to 1-for-3 converting 54-hole lead/co-lead into victories (2023 Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Kansas Wichita Open/finished T2; 2025 Albertsons Boise Open presented by Chevron/finished T3)
- Seventh international winner of the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour season
- Recorded the 14th sub-60 round in Korn Ferry Tour history at the 2025 Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Kansas Wichita Open, where he posted an 11-under 59 in the first round and eventually finished T5

- Finished No. 139 in the 2024 FedExCup Fall as a PGA TOUR rookie, leaving him with conditional TOUR status for the 2025 season
- Class of 2023 Korn Ferry Tour graduate who finished No. 11 on the 2023 Korn Ferry Tour Points List to earn PGA TOUR membership for the first time (top 30 earned TOUR membership); additionally earned 2023 Korn Ferry Tour Rookie of the Year honors off the strength of six top-10s and a win (BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by TD SYNEX) in 11 starts
- Finished No. 3 in the 2023 PGA TOUR University Ranking after five seasons at University of Illinois (2018-23), where he was a three-time Big Ten Conference Player of the Year (2021, 2022, 2023) and earned four collegiate victories, with the crown jewel being individual co-medalist honors at the 2019 Big Ten Championship

#### Additional Notes

- **Zecheng Dou**, who is a three-time Korn Ferry Tour winner, records his second consecutive runner-up finish (T2/2025 Nationwide Children's Hospital Championship) and moves to No. 19 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List
- **James Nicholas** (T3/-23) climbs from No. 78 to No. 62 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List off the strength of his best career finish on Tour (previous best: T10/2025 Veritex Bank Championship), securing fully exempt status for the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour season (top 75 on 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List)
- **Peter Kuest** (T3/-23), who stands No. 44 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, notches his second top-five finish of the 2025 campaign (2nd/Pinnacle Bank championship presented by Woodhouse); logged one top five over two previous seasons on the Korn Ferry Tour (T5/2022 Utah Championship presented by Zions Bank and Intermountain Health)
- Two-time Korn Ferry Tour winner **Johnny Keefer** (T7/-22), who stands atop the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, records his Tour-leading ninth top-10 finish of the season; no other player has more than seven
  - With one event remaining, only Keefer and **Austin Smotherman** (73/-7) are in play for the No. 1 position on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List; the No. 1 player on the Points List will earn exemptions for the 2026 PLAYERS Championship and 2026 U.S. Open
- 18-year-old **Blades Brown** (T43/-15), who stands No. 75 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, earns the final spot into the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Championship presented by United Leasing & Finance, and secures fully exempt membership for the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour season (top 75 on 2025 Points List)
- The top 75 players on the Korn Ferry Tour Points List will qualify for the Korn Ferry Tour Championship presented by United Leasing & Finance, the last of four season-ending Korn Ferry Tour Finals events
  - Four players who began the week outside the top 75 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List moved into the top 75 on the Points List
    - No. 76 **Samuel Anderson** (T9/-17) – rises to No. 70
    - No. 78 **James Nicholas** (T9/-17) – projected No. 62
    - No. 79 **Cole Hammer** (T15/-20) – rises to No. 72
    - No. 81 **Dylan Wu** (T12/-21) – rises to No. 71
  - Four players who began the week inside the top 75 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List fall out of the top 75:
    - No. 71 **Brandon Berry** (MC) – falls to No. 76
    - No. 73 **Augusto Núñez** (MC) – fall to No. 78
    - No. 74 **Carl Yuan** (T55/-13) – falls to No. 77
    - No. 75 **Fabián Gómez** (MC) – falls to No. 80
