THIS WEEK ON TOUR

- The Korn Ferry Tour season continues with the Price Cutter Charity Championship presented by Hiland Dairy Foods, the 18th event of the Tour's 26-event season.
- Highland Springs Country Club has hosted every iteration of the Price Cutter Charity Championship presented by Hiland Dairy Foods, first played in 1990. This week marks the 36th playing of the Price Cutter Charity Championship.
- The Price Cutter Charity Championship presented by Hiland Dairy Foods is one of four tournaments on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour schedule to be played every season since the Tour's inaugural 1990 season.
 - » The other three events with such distinction are the Visit Knoxville Open, Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Kansas Wichita Open, and Albertsons Boise Open presented by Chevron.
 - » Only the Price Cutter Charity Championship, Wichita Open (already contested), and Albertsons Boise Open are set to mark their 36th playing this year, as the Visit Knoxville Open was only held once (2021) amid the 2020-21 combined season.
- PGA TOUR winner Matt McCarty earned the first of his three victories last season at the Price Cutter Charity Championship presented by Hiland Dairy Foods. Declared #TOURBound following the win, McCarty went on to secure the Three-Victory Promotion just five weeks later with additional titles at the Pinnacle Bank Championship presented by Woodhouse and the Albertsons Boise Open presented by Chevron.
- Neal Shipley became the second two-time winner this season, joining Austin Smotherman, after claiming last week's title at The Ascendant presented by Blue.
 While Smotherman is not in the field this week, both players remain in pursuit of the Three-Victory Promotion, which would earn them an immediate promotion to the PGA TOUR.

2025 KEY STORYLINES

- Justin Suh, the 2022 Korn Ferry Tour Player of the Year, returned to the winner's circle earlier this season with a five-stroke victory at the 118th VISA Argentina Open presented by Macro in March. The win earned Suh an exemption for the 153rd Open Championship at Royal Portrush this week.
- Rookie Neal Shipley earned his second win of the season at last week's The
 Ascendant presented by Blue, rallying from seven strokes back to claim a one-shot
 victory. His comeback marked the largest final-round come-from-behind win on the
 Korn Ferry Tour since the 2024 Astara Chile Classic presented by Scotiabank. With the
 win, Shipley became just the second multi-time winner this season, joining Austin
 Smotherman, and vaulted to No. 4 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List.
- Austin Smotherman became the first Korn Ferry Tour member to earn a #TOURBound declaration and secure PGA TOUR membership for the 2026 season. Across a three-week stretch in June, Smotherman won the BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by TD SYNNEX and Memorial Health Championship presented by LRS, which vaulted him to the No. 1 position on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, and effectively assured himself of a top 20 finish on the final Points List. Smotherman previously graduated from the Korn Ferry Tour following the 2020-21 season, after which he played three consecutive seasons on the PGA TOUR.
- Korn Ferry Tour rookie Johnny Keefer stands No. 2 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List off the strength of his win at the 2025 Veritex Bank Championship and two runner-up finishes. In addition to five top-10s in 14 starts on Tour this season, Keefer earned starts in two of this year's major championships (PGA Championship/MC; U.S. Open/T61). Last year, Keefer finished No. 25 -- the final spot which awarded performance benefits -- in the 2024 PGA TOUR University Ranking, and finished No. 1 in the 2024 Fortinet Cup standings for the inaugural PGA TOUR Americas season.
- Canadian Myles Creighton earned his first Korn Ferry Tour title at the 2025 Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Kansas Wichita Open, highlighted by an 11-under 59 in the third round. Creighton recorded the 15th sub-60 round in Korn Ferry Tour history, though he became only the third player to accomplish the feat and win the tournament.

Korn Ferry Tour Finals refers to the final four events of the 26-event season, where players will compete for increased purses and points (600 points for winning a Finals event, compared to 500 for winning one of the 22 preceding events) to determine the season-long points race. The total purse for each of the first 22 events is \$1 million (\$180,000 to the winner) and increases to \$1.5 million (\$270,000 to the winner) for the four Korn Ferry Tour Finals events.

TOURNAMENT FIELD STORYLINES

- Field includes nine PGA TOUR winners with 17 career victories, highlighted by Ben Crane with five career TOUR victories.
- The field features 44 Korn Ferry Tour winners who have combined for 62 career victories, led by four-time Korn Ferry Tour winner Robby Shelton.
- Six players in this week's field are in the top 200 of the Official World Golf Ranking: Johnny Keefer (No. 81), Neal Shipley (No. 94), S.H. Kim (No. 141), Kensei Hirata (No. 144), Hank Lebioda (No. 159), and Trace Crowe (No. 186).
- Two-time Korn Ferry Tour winner David Kocher, the 2022 champion of the Price Cutter Charity Championship presented by Hiland Dairy Foods, is the only past winner in this week's field.
- Columbia, Missouri native Ross Steelman is one of four players in this week's field with ties to
 the state of Missouri. Steelman is coming off a T4 finish at last week's The Ascendant presented
 by Blue, marking the second-highest finish of his Korn Ferry Tour career. He held a three-stroke
 lead entering the final round and ultimately earned his fifth top-10 of the season, moving up to
 No. 24 on the Korn Ferry Tour Points List.
- Springfield natives Nick Sheppard and Nate Angus join Steelman as Missouri representatives in this week's field. Sheppard will make his Korn Ferry Tour debut, while Angus is set for his second career start on Tour and first since the 2023 Price Cutter Charity Championship. Wildwood resident Chris Naegel, who earned a spot in the field as an open qualifier, will make his first start of the 2025 season. Naegel finished No. 101 on the 2024 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, just one spot shy of retaining conditional membership for the current season.
