Today – A frontal boundary stalling across the northern tier of the Bahamas will bring scattered to numerous areas of rain and a 10-15% thunderstorm potential throughout the day – with a few instances of heavy rain possible. Winds will gradually turn northeasterly and become breezy in the afternoon. Temperatures will hover in the low 70s throughout the day, with the overnight low likely to fall back into the upper 60s.

Extended forecast – The frontal boundary will lift back to the north on Tuesday, giving way to a mix of sun and clouds along with the potential for occasional rainbands to move in off the ocean as winds shift to the east and southeast. This boundary will remain north of Great Abaco Tuesday night before turning back south Wednesday morning and shifting gusty winds to a north-northeasterly direction between 10am-12pm. There will be scattered areas of rain and isolated thunderstorm potential on Wednesday, with the highest chances forecast through the morning hours.
