Today – Skies will be a mix of sun and clouds or partly cloudy throughout the day with the temperature forecast to reach a high in the upper 70s. A pop-up shower cannot be ruled out late in the day. South-southwesterly winds will remain blustery for much of the day before gradually slackening late in the afternoon. **Forecast rainfall through 6pm: Less than 0.05" | Sunrise: 6:57am / Sunset: 5:41pm**

Extended forecast – Showers will become possible overnight ahead of a cold front set to reach Central Abaco (The Abaco Club) between 5-7am Monday morning. The front will arrive with a thin band of heavy rain and isolated thunderstorm potential. This boundary will then stall out nearby across the Northern Bahamas, promoting bouts of rain and maintaining isolated thunderstorm potential throughout Monday. Rainfall of 0.25 – 0.50" is currently forecast across Central Abaco on Monday, but locally higher totals around 1" will be possible where the heaviest cells track. This stalled boundary slowly lifts north on Tuesday, but breezy east and southeasterly winds may lead to intermittent bands of rain moving in off the ocean. Another front will arrive on Wednesday and will continue likely chances for rain, isolated thunderstorms, and windy conditions.
