• There has not been a playoff at the Arnold Palmer Invitational since Tim Herron defeated Tom Lehman in 1999; in the 25 events since then, 13 have been decided by one stroke

Collin Morikawa (1st/-10)

- Fifth career 54-hole lead/co-lead in individual stroke-play events on the PGA TOUR; 1-for-4 in converting to victory (2021 World Golf Championships-Workday Championship at The Concession)
- Had played 40 holes without a bogey until the par-3 14th en route to a third-round 5-under 67
- Has nine top-10s in 25 starts since his last win at the 2023 Baycurrent Classic, including a runner-up at the 2025 Sentry
- Has one top-10 in four starts at the Arnold Palmer Invitational (T9/2020)
- Has one top-10 in three starts this season and sits No. 13 in the FedExCup (The Sentry/2nd); entered the week with matching T17s in his most recent starts at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and The Genesis Invitational
- 28-year-old seeks seventh career TOUR victory; making his 26th start since his last win at the 2023 Baycurrent Classic
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (12.108), Strokes Gained: Approach the Green (6.116), Proximity (29'11") and Scrambling (16 of 18)

Russell Henley (2nd/-9)

- Highlighted by four straight birdies on Nos. 10-13, third-round 67 is his first round in the 60s on the weekend in six made cuts at Bay Hill
- Has one top-10 in eight starts at the Arnold Palmer Invitational (T4/2024)
- 2024 36-hole co-leader along with Shane Lowry, Hideki Matsuyama, Brian Harman, Wyndham Clark and Scottie Scheffler; closed 72-72 to finish eight strokes behind winner Scheffler
- Has three top-10 finishes in five starts this season and sits No. 17 in the FedExCup (best: AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am/T5)
- 35-year-old seeks fifth career TOUR victory; making his 47th start since his last win at the 2023 World Wide Technology Championship

Miscellaneous Notes

- **Corey Conners** (3rd/-8) enters the week with four consecutive top-25 finishes at the Arnold Palmer Invitational, including a solo third in 2021; would become the first Canadian winner of the Arnold Palmer Invitational; nine international players have won the event (10 wins); international players have won six of the first nine events this season, including fellow Canadian **Nick Taylor** at the Sony Open in Hawaii
- One day after posting his best score (64) in 41 rounds at Bay Hill, **Jason Day** (4th/-7) is three back after a 69; 2016 champion would join Ernie Els (1998, 2010) as the only international players with multiple wins at the event
- Both with bogey-free rounds, 2018 John Deere Classic champion Michael Kim (T5/-5/67) and 2024 Butterfield Bermuda Championship runner-up Andrew Novak (T7/-4/65) moved into the top 10; Kim began the day T19, while Novak started T33; Kim (Nos. 12, 16) posts two eagles in a round for the first time in 234 TOUR starts
- Second-round leader **Shane Lowry** (T7/-4) is six strokes back after a 4-over 76; 2024 54-hole co-leader finished third behind winner Scottie Scheffler and runner-up Wyndham Clark, his best finish in six starts at Bay Hill

- 2018 Arnold Palmer Invitational champion **Rory McIlroy** (T10/-3), who won the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am in his season debut, is seven back after a 1-over 73; seeking to become the ninth multiple winner of the event
- After making the cut this week (worth one point), No. 2-ranked amateur **Jackson Koivun** (T33/+3) now has 19 points in PGA TOUR University Accelerated and can reach the 20-point threshold to become eligible for PGA TOUR membership with a top-10 finish (one point); he is currently six shots outside of the top 10
