Scottie Scheffler

- World No. 1 and 2024 FedExCup champion makes his season debut and first start since hand surgery after
 puncturing his right hand with broken glass on Christmas Day; won in his last competitive start at the 2024 Hero
 World Challenge
- 13-time PGA TOUR winner won the last three Jack Nicklaus Awards as PGA TOUR Player of the Year; joins Tiger Woods as the only players to win the award in three consecutive seasons (est. 1990)
- 2024 highlighted by seven victories (the first on TOUR with seven or more wins in a season since Tiger Woods in 2007), the FedExCup and the gold medal at the 2024 Paris Olympics
- Became the first player to successfully defend his title at THE PLAYERS Championship and won the Masters
 Tournament for the second time (2022, 2024); first player to win THE PLAYERS, a major championship and the
 FedExCup in the same season
- In addition to wins at THE PLAYERS, Masters Tournament and TOUR Championship, captured four titles at Signature Events: Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, RBC Heritage, the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday and Travelers Championship
- Finished T6 at the 2024 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am in his only other start at the event

Wyndham Clark

- 2024 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am champion set the course record at Pebble Beach Golf Links with a 12-under 60 in the third round en route to winning the weather-shortened tournament
- Has three wins in 166 TOUR starts (2023 Truist Championship, 2023 U.S. Open, 2024 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am)
- Making his fifth start at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (T61/2019, T18/2020, T65/2022, Won/2024)
- Seeks to become the first player to successfully defend his title at the event since 2010 (Dustin Johnson)

Rasmus Højgaard

- Denmark native and PGA TOUR rookie will make his tournament debut as the leading finisher from the 2024 DP World Tour Race to Dubai; twin bother Nicolai, in his second year as a TOUR member, competed in the 2024 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am playing out of the same eligibility category
- Has two top-10 finishes in 22 starts on the PGA TOUR: 2022 Corales Puntacana Championship (6th), 2022 Genesis Scottish Open (T10)

• Five-time winner on the DP World Tour: 2019 AfrAsia Bank Mauritius Open, 2020 ISPS HANDA UK Championship, 2021 Omega European Masters, 2023 Made in HimmerLand, 2024 Amgen Irish Open

Viktor Hovland

- Most recent of six PGA TOUR wins came at the 2023 TOUR Championship en route to winning the FedExCup
- Finished T36 at The Sentry in his only other start this season; prior to the tournament, broke his right pinkie toe after slamming his foot into the bed frame
- Making his fourth start at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (T38/2020, T13/2023, T58/2024)
- Born and raised in Oslo, Norway, made history as the first Norwegian player to win the U.S. Amateur (2018) and the first player from Norway to compete in the Masters (2019)
- Won the 2018 U.S. Amateur and was low amateur at the 2019 U.S. Open; both events were at Pebble Beach

Rory McIlroy

- World No. 3 makes season debut and third start at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am
- Only player to win the FedExCup three times (2016, 2019, 2022)
- Leads the field with 26 victories, most recently at the 2024 Truist Championship
- Making his third start at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (MC/2018, T66/2024)
- In 2024, teamed with Jeff Rhodes (TPG Capital) to win the pro-am portion of the event by one stroke over Matt Fitzpatrick/George Still, Matthieu Pavon/Pascal Grizot and Patrick Cantlay/Egon Durban

Maverick McNealy

- AT&T Athlete and Stanford, California native will make seventh career start at AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and first since winning maiden PGA TOUR title (2024 RSM Classic)
- Has two top-five finishes in seven starts at Pebble Beach: (MC/2018, T5/2020, 2nd/2021, T33/2022, WD/2023, T39/2024)
- In the field as the lead player in the Aon Next 10 (Nos. 51-60 in the FedExCup Fall)

Jordan Spieth

- AT&T Athlete and 2017 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am champion is in the field as a sponsor exemption as he plays his final year of a Tournament Winners exemption
- Making first appearance on TOUR since undergoing wrist surgery after his 2024 season ended in August
- Making 13th start at the event, with six top-10 finishes (T4/2014, T7/2015, 1st/2017, T9/2020, T3/2021, 2nd/2022)

AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am notes

- The AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am is the fifth event of the 2025 PGA TOUR season and second Signature Event
- AT&T is the longest running continuous title sponsor on the PGA TOUR (since 1986) and is celebrating its 40th year as title sponsor of the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am
- The no-cut AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am will feature amateurs playing alongside professionals during the first two rounds at Pebble Beach and Spyglass Hill; all 80 professionals will then play on the weekend at Pebble Beach only
- The field features:
 - 45 of the top 50 players in the Official World Golf Ranking, highlighted by World No. 1 Scottie
 Scheffler, No. 3 Rory McIlroy, No. 4 Collin Morikawa and No. 5 Hideki Matsuyama
 - Five past champions: Wyndham Clark (2024), Justin Rose (2023), Tom Hoge (2022), Nick Taylor (2020), Jordan Spieth (2017)
 - o 62 PGA TOUR winners, led by Rory McIlroy (26), Justin Thomas (15), Adam Scott (14), Jason Day (13), Scottie Scheffler (13), Jordan Spieth (13), Hideki Matsuyama (11), Justin Rose (11)
 - Eight past FedExCup champions (10 wins): Billy Horschel/2014, Jordan Spieth/2015, Rory McIlroy/2016/2019/2022, Justin Thomas/2017, Justin Rose/2018, Patrick Cantlay/2021, Viktor Hovland/2023, Scottie Scheffler/2024 Note; every FedExCup champion dating to 2014 is in the field with the exception of Dustin Johnson/2020
 - Last week's Farmers Insurance Open champion Harris English will make his fourth start at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (T40/2012, MC/2013, 76th/2024)
 - Sponsor exemptions: Rickie Fowler, Harry Hall, Jordan Spieth, Gary Woodland; Keith Mitchell originally received an exemption but ended up getting in on his own number and was replaced with Hall
- Eligible PGA TOUR Members in the 80-player Signature Event are:
 - o Top 50 players from the prior year's FedExCup Playoffs & Eligibility Points List through the Playoffs

- Aon Next 10: available players, not otherwise exempt, from the prior year's FedExCup Fall Points List through The RSM Classic
- The leading finisher from the prior season's Race to Dubai, not otherwise exempt in the Top 50 of the FedExCup Playoffs & Eligibility Points List through the Playoffs
- Aon Swing 5: top five available players, not otherwise exempt, who accumulate the most FedExCup points in the "swing" of full-field events prior to the event (Sony Open in Hawaii, The American Express, Farmers Insurance Open)
- Official Tournament Winners of full FedExCup point events in the current season, not otherwise exempt
- PGA TOUR Members, not otherwise exempt, who are within the Top 30 of the Official World Golf Ranking as of the Monday of tournament week (Monday, January 27, 2025)
- o Four sponsor exemptions restricted to PGA TOUR members
- o If necessary to complete a field of 80 players, those players below the top 10 available players from the prior year's FedExCup Fall Points List in priority order
- Due to dangerous weather conditions, the 2024 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am was reduced to 54 holes, with third-round leader Wyndham Clark earning his third PGA TOUR victory by one stroke over Ludvig Åberg; it was the first 54-hole tournament on TOUR since the 2016 Zurich Classic of New Orleans; the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am was also shortened to 54 holes in 2009

PGA TOUR season notes

- Each of the first four tournaments of the 2025 PGA TOUR Season have been won by players with multiple victories on TOUR (Hideki Matsuyama/11/The Sentry, Nick Taylor/5/Sony Open in Hawaii, Sepp Straka/3/The American Express, Harris English/5/Farmers Insurance Open)
- 2025 marks the second season in the last 55 years where the first three events of a season were won by an international player (Hideki Matsuyama/Japan, Nick Taylor/Canada, Sepp Straka/Austria); in 2003 Ernie Els (South Africa) won the first two events in Hawaii and Vijay Singh (Fiji) won the third in Phoenix; Harris English snapped the streak with his win at last week's Farmers Insurance Open
- The Aon Next 10 represents the top 10 players not already exempt, from the FedExCup standings, while the Aon Swing 5 includes the top five FedExCup points earners, not already exempt, from a collection of Full-Field Events leading up to each Signature Event; the Aon Next 10 for the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and The Genesis Invitational was determined through the 2024 FedExCup Fall standings
- Last week's Farmers Insurance Open, which followed the Sony Open in Hawaii and The American Express, marked the final opportunity for players to earn FedExCup points towards the Aon Swing 5 for entry into this week's AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am; the top five players not otherwise exempt who earn the most FedExCup points during those three events and the WM Phoenix Open, will qualify for The Genesis Invitational
