Russell Henley (1st/-8)

- With a first-round 8-under 64 at Spyglass Hill Golf Course, holds a one-stroke lead over six players
- Holds the 18-hole lead/co-lead for the ninth time on TOUR; 0-for-8 converting the first-round lead/co-lead to victory
- Making sixth start at AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, 64 marks his career best in 18 rounds at the event
- Most recent of his four PGA TOUR victories came at the 2022 World Wide Technology Championship
- Making third start of the season (T30/The Sentry, T10/Sony Open in Hawaii)
- Finished in a tie for No. 4 in the 2024 FedExCup standings, his first top-five result in the FedExCup; has finished in the top 100 in each of his first 12 seasons on TOUR

Holes-in-one

- Marks the first time since 2009 multiple aces (2) were recorded in a round at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (most: 3/1989/R2)
- Making his season debut, three-time FedExCup Champion and 26-time PGA TOUR winner Rory McIlroy (T8/-6) aces the par-3 15th hole with a 54-degree wedge from 119 yards at Spyglass Hill Golf Course, his second hole-in-one on TOUR (2023 Travelers Championship/R1/No. 8)
- Shane Lowry (T8/-6) records a hole-in-one on the par-3 No. 7 with a 54-degree wedge from 113 yards at Pebble Beach Golf Links, his third ace on TOUR (2016 Masters/R4/No. 16, 2022 PLAYERS Championship/R3/No. 17)
- Marks the eighth hole-in-one on No. 7 at Pebble Beach Golf Links and first since Ricky Barnes (2021/R1)
- Last player to make a hole-in-one and go on to win was Justin Rose at the 2023 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am

Miscellaneous Notes

- The AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am is the fifth event of the 2025 PGA TOUR season and second Signature Event; the no-cut event features amateurs playing alongside professionals during the first two rounds at Pebble Beach and Spyglass Hill; all 80 professionals will then play on the weekend at Pebble Beach only
- Six different countries represented at 7-under 65 (T2), Jake Knapp (United States), Justin Rose (England), Cam Davis (Australia), Sepp Straka (Austria), Rasmus Højgaard (Denmark), Viktor Hovland (Norway)
- 2023 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am champion **Justin Rose** (T2/-7) seeks to become the event's 13th multiple winner; one of five past champions in the field
- Making his first start as a member, PGA TOUR rookie Rasmus Højgaard (T2/-7) earned his card as the leading finisher from the 2024 DP World Tour Race to Dubai; last to win in first start as a TOUR member Emiliano Grillo (2015 Procore Championship)
- Making his season debut, World No. 1 **Scottie Scheffler** (T15) opens with a 5-under 67 at Spyglass Hill Golf Course; his best finish in his season debut on TOUR: T5/2024 Sentry

- At 13-under, **Sahith Theegala/**Shantanu Narayen and **Si Woo Kim/**Ron Kruszewski lead the Pro-Am portion of the competition
- First-round scoring averages: Pebble Beach Golf Links (68.175), Spyglass Hill Golf Course (69.775)
