Sepp Straka (1st/-14)

- Claims a three-stroke lead after a pair of 65s in each of the first two rounds
- Marks the largest 36-hole lead by any player this season in the fifth event of the year
- Holds the 36-hole lead/co-lead for the second time on TOUR (2024 RBC Heritage/finished T5)
- Leads all players this week with 16 birdies through 36 holes
- Making third career appearance at AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (T26/2024, MC/2019)
- Three-time PGA TOUR winner, bidding for his second win this year (2025 American Express)
- Making fourth start of the season (T15/The Sentry, T30/Sony Open in Hawaii, Won/The American Express)
- 14-under marks second-best score to par through 36 holes in TOUR career (best: 15-under/2025 American Express)
- Finished No. 27 in the 2024 FedExCup standings, his sixth consecutive season qualifying for the FedExCup playoffs and third straight year advancing to the TOUR Championship

Miscellaneous Notes

- The AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am is the fifth event of the 2025 PGA TOUR season and second Signature Event; the no-cut event features amateurs playing alongside professionals during the first two rounds at Pebble Beach and Spyglass Hill; all 80 professionals will then play on the weekend at Pebble Beach only
- 18-hole solo leader **Russell Henley** (T2/-11) is bidding to become the third consecutive winner on TOUR from the University of Georgia (Sepp Straka/The American Express, Harris English/Farmers Insurance Open)
- Cam Davis (T2/-11) claims his best 36-hole position on TOUR since the 2022 Travelers Championship (also T2); making his sixth appearance at AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (best finish: T14/2021)
- Making his fourth start at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, **Tony Finau** (T4/-10) claims best 36-hole score at the event (134) after back-to-back 67s (previous best: 139/2017)
- Tom Kim (T4/-10) and Andrew Novak (T4/-10) post bogey-free 65s, tied for the low round of the day along with Straka and Billy Horschel (T20/-7)
- 2023 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am champion Justin Rose (T4/-10) seeks to become the event's 13th multiple winner
- Austin Eckroat (T4/-10) sits inside the top five after 36 holes for the fifth time in his career; in two of the previous four instances, Eckroat went on to win (2024 Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches, 2024 World Wide Technology Championship)
- At 20-under, **Andrew Novak** and Philippe Laffont (Coatue Management) win the Pro-Am portion of the competition by one stroke over **Sahith Theegala**/Shantanu Narayen and **Tony Finau**/Ryan Smith
- Ludvig Åberg (illness) withdrew prior to the start of the second round
